Morinville Jets fall to Merchants

The Morinville Jets' six-game winning streak ended at home Tuesday night after falling 6-2 to the visiting St. Albert Merchants.

Heading into Tuesday night's game, the Jets and Merchants both sat with 11-3-1 records and 23 points. Outpacing the Jets' 93 goals to 82 this season, the Merchants occupied second place in the Capital Junior Hockey League's West Division, the Jets-third place.

A win for the Jets would have pushed them ahead of the Merchants in wins and points, giving them second place.

The Jets opened Tuesday night's game on a solid note, leading the Merchants 2-1.

That fortune reversed itself by the end of the middle frame, with the Jets trailing the Merchants 4-2.

Another 20 minutes saw the Merchants keeping the Jets off the board while amassing another two goals for their tally.

As of Tuesday night, the Jets

now sat two points behind the Merchants and three points behind the West Division's leading Beverly Warriors.

The Jets played two more games at home this past weekend, Saturday against the Beverly Warriors and Sunday night against the North Edmonton Red Wings. The last outing between the Jets and Warriors resulted in an overtime loss for the Jets. The last time they faced the Red Wings, they fell 5-4.

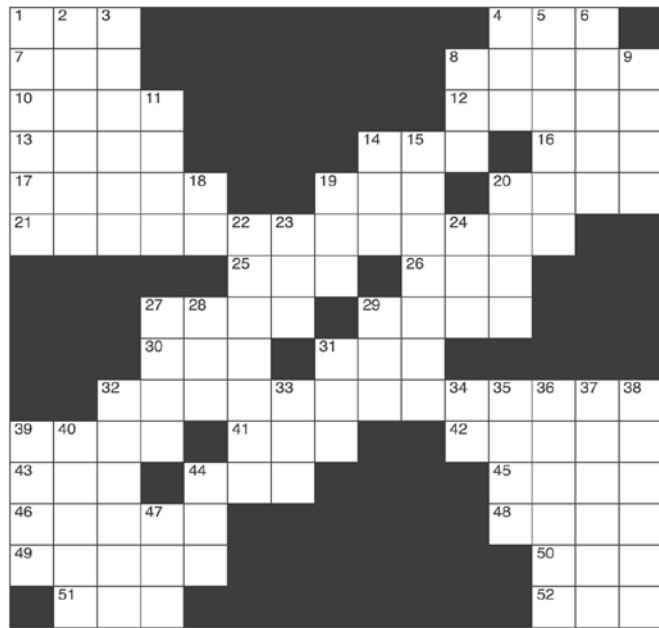

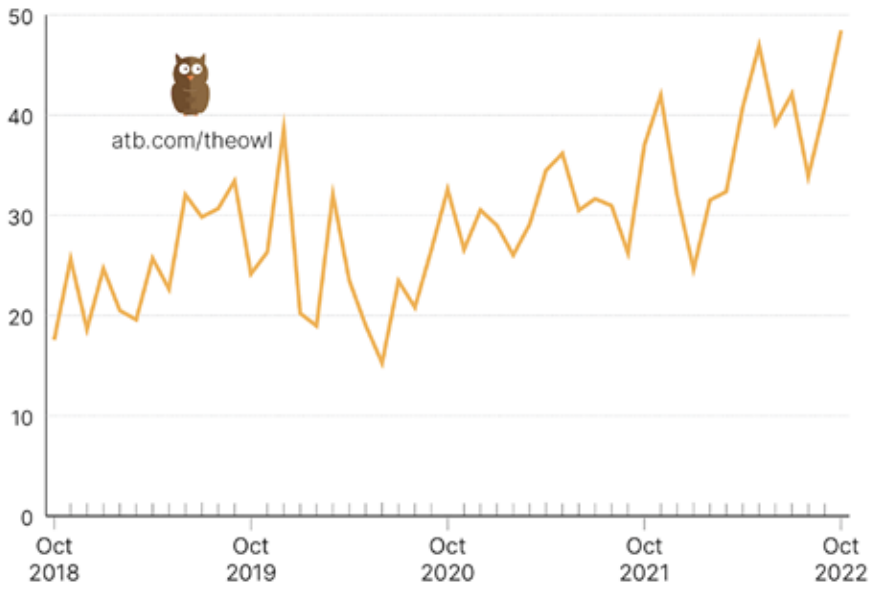

Housing starts in Alberta spiked in October

The number of seasonally-adjusted housing starts* in Alberta increased by 19.1% in October compared to the month before. Starts haven't been this high since March 2015.

Things went in the other direction nationally, with monthly starts down by 10.6%. Starts were up in five provinces, but down in the other five.

It's not unusual for housing starts (even after seasonal adjustment) to bounce around from month to month, but up is still a much better economic sign than down.

Taking a longer time period into account, the number of housing starts in Alberta over the first ten months of the year was 22.3% higher than

over the same period in 2021 and 63.7% higher than in 2020.

Nationally, year-to-date housing starts were down by 4.5% compared to 2021 and up by 24.8% compared to 2020.

Net gains from interprovincial migration and stronger economic growth relative to other parts of the country help explain the recent surge in new home construction in Alberta.

*A housing start is defined as the beginning of construction work on the building where the dwelling unit will be located. This can be described in two ways: 1) the stage when the concrete has been poured for the whole of the footing around the structure; or 2) an equivalent stage where a basement will not be part of the structure.

Virtual innovations make health supports more accessible

Three new virtual innovations are making influenza information and other health supports more accessible for Albertans.

To share information about influenza, Alberta Health Services (AHS) has launched an online Ask an Expert page. Through the page, Albertans can submit common questions about influenza vaccine and virus and receive responses from AHS medical officers of health (MOH) within two working days.

All MOH responses will be posted on the page to form a larger community of information sharing.

Note: this page cannot be used for personal medical advice or individual health assessments. For non-urgent health assessment, Albertans are encouraged to call Health Link at 811.

Health Link has also added a new Virtual Hold feature to

its nursing call line, which will address the service's increased call volume and ensure Albertans can easily access health advice from an 811 registered nurse.

Through this feature, Albertans can request a call back, instead of waiting on hold, when there is a queue for Health Link 811 nurse advice. Albertans will receive a call back from a Health Link registered nurse as soon as their turn in the queue comes up.

In addition, Albertans can now text the word 'flu' to 88111 and receive information on influenza vaccine and illness by text. This ensures information is available to those who are more comfortable with text or prefer not to call Health Link for influenza information.

As always, information on Influenza and COVID-19 vaccines is also available at www.ahs.ca/vaccine.

"Alberta's government supports AHS in its leveraging of virtual and digital technologies," says Jason Copping, Minister of Health.

"Innovations like these empower Albertans in managing their health and help them feel connected with the healthcare system at all times."
