# Boston Pizza Morinville franchise ranked second in the country for company standards

Morinville's Boston Pizza franchise recently learned they were the second-ranked franchise in the country regarding the company's Core Brand Standard Assessment (CBSA).

"It centers on Boston Pizza's core operational standards with a strong focus on food safety, our core brand standards, dough and pasta preparation, and the Foundations of Hospitality," said Lorinda Santos Franchisee Representative for Boston Pizza, Morinville.

The CBSA is a two-day assessment of all franchises across the country, done twice a year, where the Regional office manager comes to the restaurant to evaluate.

"Our restaurant got 98.61 out of 100," Santos said, noting a restaurant from Ontario got a perfect score of 100.

Recognition for Morinville's second highest honour in the country occurred at the Leadership Conference 2022 in Calgary.

"All Boston Pizzas across Canada have representatives at the Conference, Franchisees, GMs, KMs, and Boston Pizza International," Santos explained.

"I was not able to attend the Conference. I got the phone call from Malinda [Northcott], the General Manager, right after they got off the stage to get the recognition. It felt amazing! I felt so proud, especially of the staff who always work hard and give their best. I always say we have the best staff here at Boston Pizza Morinville!"

Earning the recognition should give guests further reassurance of the quality they receive at the local restaurant.

"We feel that our guests would have a level of comfort knowing

### County animal sanctuary receives \$12,000 from NWR bottle drive

A Sturgeon County animal sanctuary has an extra \$12,000 to do its valuable work, thanks to the generosity of Northwest Redwater Partnership's Sturgeon Refinery's turnaround group.

Out of Africa Animal Sanctuary received a cheque for \$12,019 from the bottle drive fundraiser.

The sanctuary started 20 years ago, in 2002, when Sandy Raubenheimer and her husband emigrated from South Africa, settling northwest of Edmonton in Riviere Qui Barre.

For the past 19 years, the couple has been rescuing animals and using their sanctuary as a place where volunteers use animals as part of their healing process.

Sandy Raubenheimer said she was happy to receive the donation. "A marvellous lady named Rachel Reis and her daughter recognized the work that we aspire to do at our charity," Raubenheimer said.

"It is because of her compassion that we received a recent donation of \$12,019 from the folks at NWR. "

Morinville resident and logistics and ISBL coordinator for the turnaround group

Rachel Reis told Morinville Online that NWR donates their bottle money to various organizations within Sturgeon County.

"Because this was a turnaround event, I jumped on the chance to donate to this group," Reis explained.

"I wrote a letter stating why I wanted to nominate this group, and it was approved."

It took just over four months to raise the money through bottle collections. Reis said all contractors involved with the refinery turnaround used the recycle bins set out for collection.

Reis said she first heard about Out of Africa Animal Sanctuary through her child's school when the school made a class trip.

"One of my kids has been going every week since. It's a place of hard work, acceptance, no judgment and feeling like you can make a difference," she said.

Feeding the animals makes you feel important in their life and wanted. Seeing a smile when I pick them up at the end of their visit made it all worthwhile and a place I will be forever grateful for."

Raubenheimer said the funds would be well used this winter.



"Because of their donation and generosity, we are now able to feed 33 horses and two donkeys over the winter months and will have the ability to care for an additional 75 plus animals that call our sanctuary home," Raubenheimer said.

"Our charity relies 100 percent on donations and it is because of companies like NWR that our animals have a fighting chance, and in turn, the opportunity for our youth to experience and

grow through their time on the farm. We cannot express in words, the magnitude of the impact their donation has made to our charity. We are humbled and grateful.


Reis said the work Out of Africa Animal Sanctuary does is essential, and volunteers are critical.

"Without her volunteers, this place wouldn't exist," Reis said. "Sandy, the owner, is the hardest working lady I know. She relies on volunteers and spends a lot of her own money to make sure these animals don't starve. Heart of gold."

### **Employment declined** in Alberta in November

The Alberta economy shed 15,100 edged up slightly in November, jobs in November for a seasonally-adjusted drop of 0.6% compared to October.

Full-time positions fell by 0.5% (-10,000) while part-time jobs pulled back by 1.1% (-5,100).

As a result, the provincial unemployment rate jumped from 5.2% to 5.8%.

Nationally, the number of jobs

growing by 0.1% (+10,100) with gains in full-time employment (+0.3%), but losses in part-time work (-1.1%).

The national unemployment rate also improved slightly, going from 5.2% to 5.1%.

Employment was down in 7 out of 10 provinces, with Quebec posting the largest increase at +0.6%.
