Legally Blonde was another MCHS Drama success

It's been a novel, a feature movie, and a Broadway play, and last week it was Morinville Community High School's (MCHS) latest theatrical production.

Legally Blonde performed its opening night to a packed audience at the Morinville Community Cultural Centre Wednesday night and followed that opening night success with two more shows on Thursday and Friday.

Following on last year's highly-successful production of Newsies, MCHS drama teacher and director Vanessa King said picking a show each year is challenging because there are many elements to consider.

In choosing a show, King looks at potential cast size and composition, vocal range and choreographic ability, as well as a show that provides as many roles as possible.

Once again this year, King served in the role of director, and Riley Quinn took on the part of music director.

This year's production, with a cast of 28, was predominantly female and saw outstanding performances

from all involved.

The lead role of Elle Woods was competently performed by Dalice Brown, as were the performances of Tristan Hilman as Emmett, Alana Mathieu as Vivienne, Kaleb Imgrund-Harvey as Warner, William Luger as Professor Callahan, Jillian Andrews as Brooke.

Avery Pelletier, Amy Begg, Janessa Piche, Karsyn Richardson, Madden Coules, Isabella Harding, Avry Thomson, Alexis Wallace, Vaeh Dale, London Wood, Brianna Farrow, Lauren Andrews, Katie Fingler, Clara Wessel were all excellent in their supporting roles.

Other cast members who played exceptional singular and multiple roles were Ellie Tatti, Finn Deveau, Mia Sullivan, Jay-Cee White-Arcand, Olivia St-Onge, Sophie Allard, Benji Allain and Elizabeth Nelson.

During Wednesday night's intermission, King applauded her cast and the audience that had come to see them.

"It feels amazing. The energy of the cast is great, but this audience is outstanding," King said. I can hear them from the mezzanine, just cheering midway through

songs. That kind of energy is what live theatre is all about. We're so happy."

Auditions were in mid-September, and rehearsals started five days later.

Auditions took up two hours daily after school, with the occasional eight-hour push on weekends.

Professional development Days saw five-hour choreography-building sessions with the production's choreography team.

The months of effort showed Wednesday night in a flawless performance that drew cheers and applause through the two acts and a standing ovation after the show.

The musical stage version of the 2001 Reese Witherspoon film offered some differences, including a stronger message of female empowerment.

Despite the story being carried mainly through song, those who attended would recognize many lines made famous by Witherspoon that popped up in the script.

Legally Blonde was the school's second production of 2022. Newsies performed a series of sold-out shows in May.

Council approves 2023 Operating and 2023 – 2027 Capital Budget

Morinville Town Council passed the 2023 – 2025 Operating Budget and the 2023 – 2027 Capital Budget at the Regular Meeting of Council held Tuesday, December 6, 2022.

Council began deliberation over Administration’s preliminary budget at October 25, 2022 Council meeting. Since then, Council and Administration have worked collaboratively through a very challenging budget process to address historic levels of inflation, supply chain issues and economic uncertainties, which have driven cost increases across the municipality.

Council wanted to develop a balanced approach to address rising costs and, therefore, focused on two key elements: keeping tax increases to a minimum and targeted reductions to operational expenses.

Operational adjustments were made to both the Morinville Leisure Centre and Morinville Community Cultural Centre to reduce expenses and minimize necessary tax increases.

The impacts of those operational adjustments are as follows:

Morinville Leisure Centre reduced operating hours to the following:

- 3rd Monday in August to April 30th
 - Current operational hours maintained (6 am – 11 pm)
 - CLOSED for all statutory holidays
- May 1st to 3rd Sunday in August
 - Operational hours (Monday – Saturday) reduced to 8 am – 8 pm
 - CLOSED on all Sundays and statutory holidays

Morinville Community Cultural Centre reduced operating hours to the following:

- CLOSED Saturdays and Sundays unless booked for an event
- September 1 – June 30: regular operational hours (7 am – 11 pm)
- July 1 – August 31: Monday – Friday from 8 am – 6 pm

Council approved by a vote of 5 – 2 (Councillors Anheliger and St. Denis opposing) the 2023-2025 Operating Budget and 2023-2027 Capital Budget as presented, amending the general municipal tax requisition to \$11,605,193.

This results in a projected residential tax increase of 3.5%, subject to fluctuations in property tax assessment. This equates to an average increase of \$7.89/month for homeowners. Please be

advised that in addition to the projected tax rate approved by Council, non-residential rates will also be impacted by the Taxation Policy that moves the residential to non-residential tax ratio from 1:1.1 to 1:1.15.

The combined impact on the average non-residential property will be an increase of \$47.87/month for commercial accounts and \$155.39/month for industrial accounts.

The final municipal tax rates will be approved this spring when the Property Tax Bylaw is passed.

“I want to thank my Council colleagues and Administration for the tremendous work they have done on behalf of the Morinville’s residents and business owners on this budget. This was a daunting task, especially in a year when we experienced significant inflation. Collaboration and input from our community, along with many other considerations, has brought us to where we are today,” said Mayor Simon Boersma. “We are committed to balancing the needs of the community while respecting the cost impacts that come with those needs. We are mindful that service adjustments are difficult in these economic times, so it was important to

focus on keeping a close eye on expenses as well as ensuring we are putting money into our reserves.”

The 2023 Capital Budget was approved for \$3,249,980. The following projects were included in this capital plan:

- Residential Road Rehab (\$824,980)
- Main and Arterial Road Rehab (\$350,000)
- Sidewalk Rehab Program (\$250,000)
- Parks Infrastructure Rehab Program (\$60,000)
- Sanitary Sewer Trunk and Manhole Relining (\$300,000)
- Utilities Infrastructure Renewal Program (\$325,000)
- Municipal Buildings – Major Repairs and Refurbishments (\$165,000)
- Fleet & Equipment Replacements (975,000)

Utility Bylaws

During the meeting, Council also approved the 2023 Fees and Charges Bylaw, which now includes rates for water, wastewater, solid waste and stormwater. Increased costs for the supply of water and treatment of wastewater, along with inflationary pressures on maintenance and operations,

have resulted in necessary increases across the board.

- Water
 - Rates have increased from 2.74/m³ to 2.90/m³.
 - Administrative fixed charges have increased from \$4.70 to \$5.00 per month.
 - Service capacity charges remain unchanged.
- Wastewater
 - Rates have increased from 1.42/m³ to 1.56/m³.
 - Administrative fixed charges have increased from \$3.50 to \$4.00 per month.
 - Service capacity charges remain unchanged.
- Stormwater charges are increasing from \$10/month for residential and \$20/month for non-residential to \$15/month for residential and \$30/month for non-residential.
- Solid Waste
 - Rates are remaining the same.
 - Administrative fees are increased from \$0.60 to \$0.86 per month.
 - Roseridge dumping charges will now include a 5% administration fee to cover the Town’s cost of administering charges through utility billing.

Sturgeon County enhances competitiveness with launch of Major Investment Incentives Program

Sturgeon County approved municipal tax exemptions of up to two per cent for large-scale investments to enhance its domestic and global competitiveness.

The **Major Investment Incentives Bylaw** offers investors tax exemptions on eligible capital costs for new or expanded value-added agriculture and solar power production projects undertaken in the County.

“Sturgeon County is committed to attracting large-scale, long-term investment that drives the local economy and creates jobs for our residents. We must position ourselves to attract businesses, and these incentives position the County as a premier investment destination in our target industries.” - Sturgeon County Mayor Alanna Hnatiw

These incentives have the potential to attract investment in projects that will bring in millions in municipal tax revenue over their lifetimes. The municipal tax revenue from these projects will far exceed the incentive amounts.

“At a time when development costs are rising, these tax incentives can help us secure investment by closing the gap

for investors that face high capital, labour and transportation costs in Alberta.” - Michael Richard, acting director of Economic Innovation and Growth

To be eligible for tax incentives, value-added agricultural projects in Sturgeon County must have an investment of at least \$20 million.

If projects meet eligibility criteria, they could access municipal tax exemptions of either 1.5 or two per cent of eligible capital costs.

Solar power production projects in Sturgeon County’s portion of Alberta’s Industrial Heartland must have an investment of at least \$200 million.

If projects meet eligibility criteria, they could access municipal tax exemptions of one per cent of eligible capital costs.

The Major Investment Incentives Program is complementary to the County’s existing energy value chain incentives, and incentives offered by the provincial and federal governments.

Reviews are underway to consider additional sectors that may merit inclusion within the incentives program.

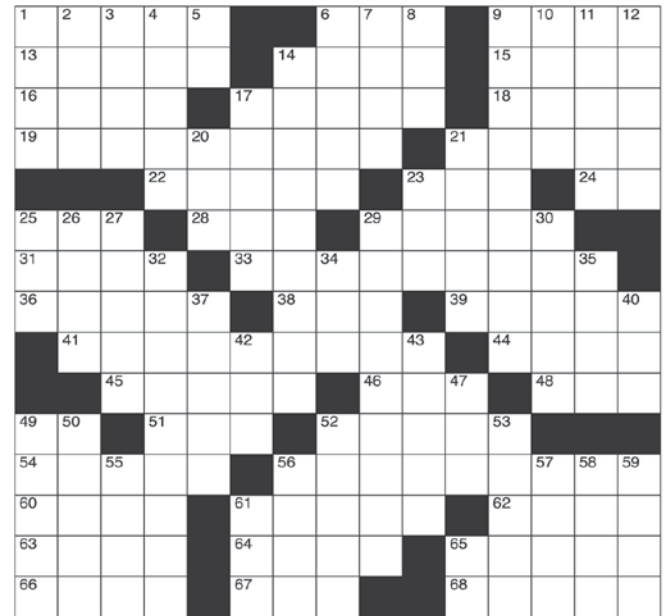
Sturgeon County will start accepting applications in early 2023.

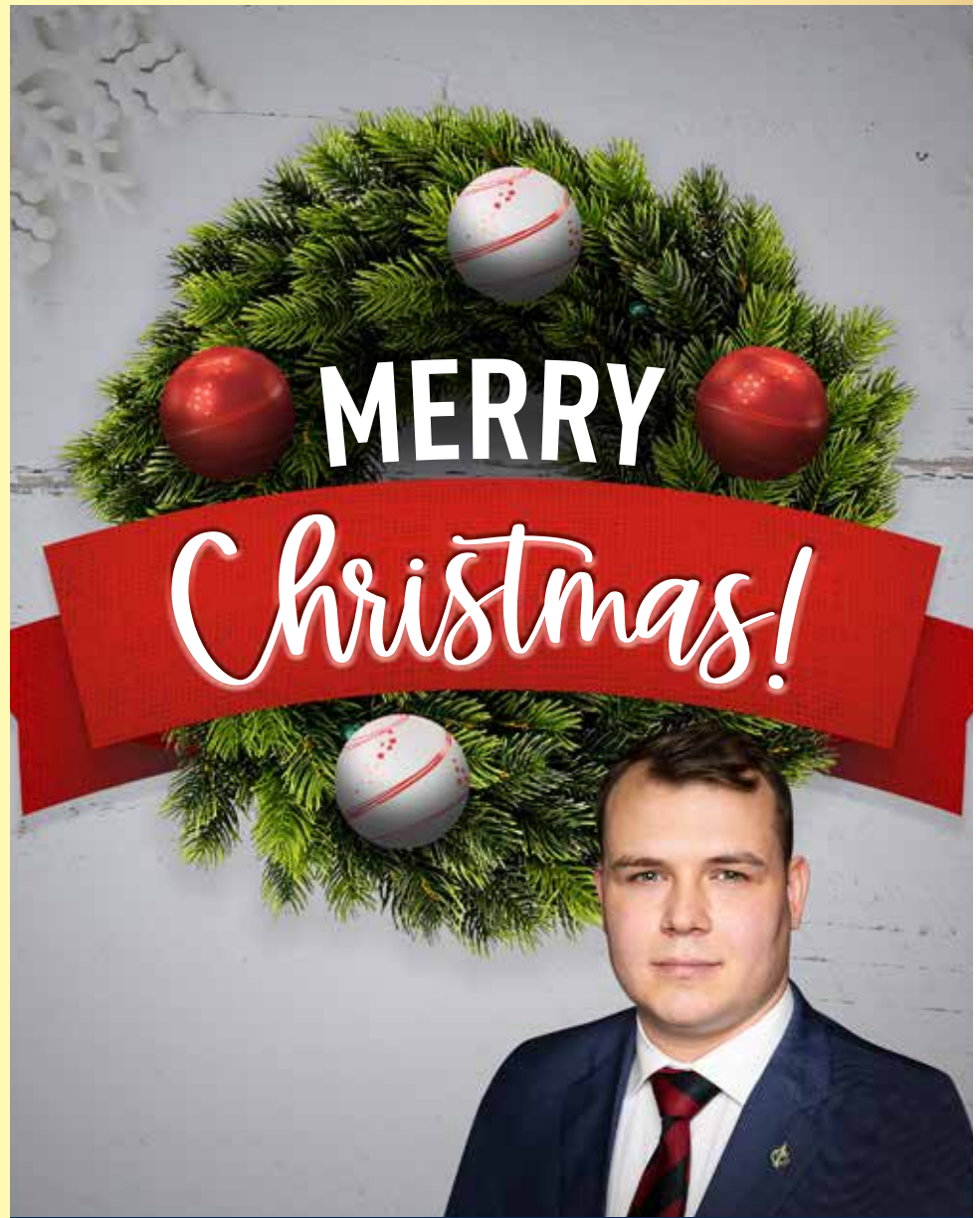

Peter Lougheed was Premier of Alberta at the time. With the goal of spurring economic development across the province, the government provided support to communities to open alfalfa processing plants. At the peak of the alfalfa processing industry, there were 14 plants in Alberta. Today, LAP is the only plant in Alberta that is dehydrating freshly chopped alfalfa and turning it into pellets.

Along with dehydrated alfalfa pellets, LAP also makes Timothy Grass Pellets, Alfalfa Cubes and Timothy Alfalfa Cubes. These four products are marketed across Western Canada, branded ALFA TEC. Over the years they have made different products but today, these four are the base of their business.

Those who have worked with LAP over the years will fondly know Clem Blanchette. Clem has dedicated over 40 years of his life to LAP and is a significant part of why the business is thriving. When asked why LAP has been able to survive all these years, Clem humbly notes that among many factors, the location of the plant has been key. The farming area around Legal is perfectly situated to grow alfalfa. The climate is ideal, and the soil is superb. Location has also helped with distribution of product. When the local rail line was decommissioned, business had to adjust and now, trucking is the only method of transportation available. While other alfalfa plants were forced to close their doors to the high cost of transportation, LAP was still able to make ends meet due to its proximity to Edmonton's two major rail yards.

In the late 90's and early 2000's, Clem recalls that a significant portion of the provinces' dehydrated alfalfa pellets were being exported to Japan. Around that time, the cost of natural gas skyrocketed and the

cost for many plants to dehydrate alfalfa soared. As a result, the Japanese market dropped off significantly. This left plant operators with the option of shutting their doors or trying to find new markets. As manager of LAP, Clem hired a talented sales manager. This led to growth in the equine market as bagged products were distributed across Western Canada. Under Clem's leadership, LAP positioned itself as the consistent provider of a quality product. With Clem, quality always came first.

Over the years, Clem's commitment to quality and his willingness to do what needed to be done is a significant factor in LAP's continued growth. With the foundation that he laid over his four decades of service, he, along with those he worked with, have positioned the next generation of LAP employees for success. The team at LAP, past and present, would like to thank Clem for his dedication and hard work over the last 45 years and wish him all the best in retirement. Thank you, Clem.

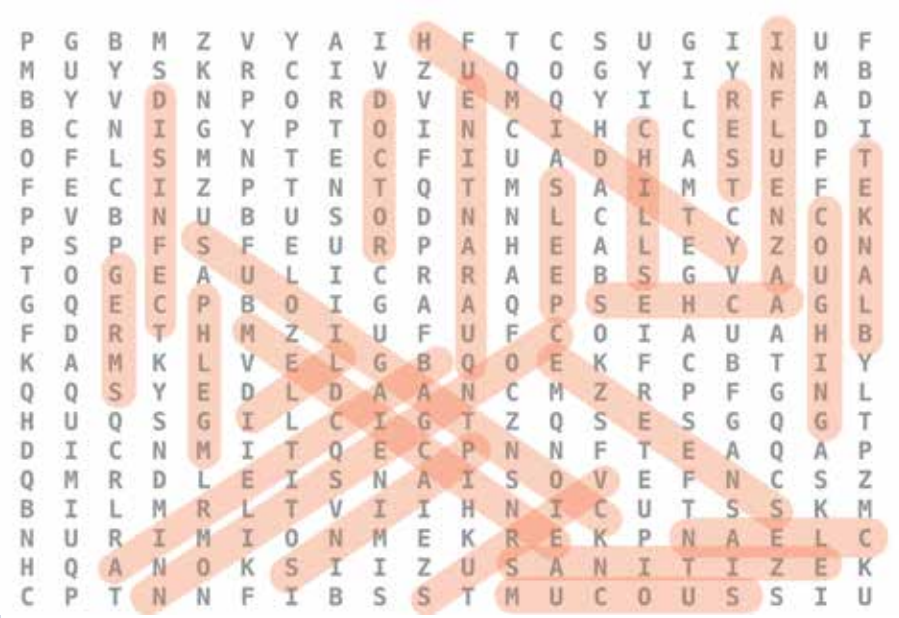
