Edmonton Musical Theatre (EMT) is gearing up to celebrate its 45th year-end production at the Westbury Theatre on Whyte Avenue with Broadway Rocks Again from June 1 to 4.

The show is a revival of EMTs' biggest hit from 16 years ago, Broadway Rocks.

Directed and choreographed by Peter Mills, with music direction by Brad Heintzman, the musical promises to be an extravaganza of beloved hits from ABBA, QUEEN, Elvis Presley, The Beach Boys, Journey, Whitesnake, and other iconic artists.

The storyline revolves around Johnny, who wants to realize his dream of hosting his own live entertainment TV show. That show, The Johnny Platter Show, sees its rating plummet, and Johnny and his group face the

and Lance, two talented singers on the show; Judy and Mikey, the production assistants; and Karen, who secretly carries a longing for Johnny.

# Morinville signs Fire Services Agreement with Sturgeon County and Mutual Aid Agreement with Alexander First Nation

At last week's regular meeting of Council, it was announced that Morinville had recently signed a Fire Services Agreement with Sturgeon County and a Mutual Aid Agreement with Alexander First Nation.

The signing of these agreements show a collaboration between the municipalities to continue to provide a high level of emergency services to the residents of Morinville and surrounding area.

Agreements such as this demonstrate Morinville's commitment to be a trusted and valued partner in regional and community stakeholder collaboration and collaboratively prioritize the safety and well-being of residents and businesses, two goals of Morinville's 2022-2025 Strategic Plan. "We are proud of these formal agreements with both Sturgeon County and Alexander First Nation and thankful we provide support and can count on our neighbours to provide support if and when needed," explains Mayor Simon Boersma.

"We are pleased to be able to provide and receive the support from our mutual aid partners and utilize the additional resources, staffing and apparatus our departments can deliver," says Brad Boddez, Fire Chief/Manager, Community Safety Services.

The agreement with Sturgeon County is in effect until December 31, 2026.

The agreement with Alexander First Nation does not have an expiration date.



# Morinville to consider improved snowclearing standard for residential roads

Residential roads in Morinville would see an increased snow-clearing level if a proposed measure is adopted by town council.

Clearing residential streets when compacted snow accumulates to a depth of 12 centimetres instead of the current 15 centimetres was recommended in an update report on the town's snow and ice control program presented to council at its regular meeting on Tuesday, May 23.

The recommendation is based on the results of a survey done in late March to gain feedback from residents about their satisfaction with the snow program.

The survey received more than 500 responses. "What we found is that the majority of residents are in favour of increasing snow levels," stated Jordan Betteridge, Acting General Manager, Community and Infrastructure Services.

A higher service level, resulting in clearing beginning at less snow accumulation, was supported by 67% of survey respondents, who saw problems with both driving and parking at the current level.

Of those who wanted a higher service level, 66% opted for a 12-centimetre threshold and 34% for a threshold of 10 centimetres.

The survey included the costs of improved service, which would be about \$33,000 for a 12-centimetre threshold and \$74,000 for a

"What we found is 10-centimetre threshnat the majority of old, based on average esidents are in favour snowfall.

> Most survey respondents were satisfied with the level of service on main, arterial and collector roads, where snow is cleared at a depth of 10 centimetres or less.

Betteridge said the results may reflect the fact that in the past Morinville formerly had a higher level of residential snow removal.

"Morinville used to have one of the best snow-clearing levels in the region," he said. "In the last decade, it has been slowly regressing to where it is now, mostly due to the financial considerations of the town." The policy was

changed from a 5-centimetre threshold in 2013, to a 5-10 centimetre threshold, and then to the current threshold in 2020 as a cost control measure following an above-average snowfall season.

With the survey results in mind, administration has recommended that the change to a 12-centimetre threshold be considered as part of council's 2024 budget deliberations.

"Residents complaints should lesson with improved service results," said Betteridge. "Hopefully with increasing the service levels, we will be more aligned with what the residents expect."

Along with satisfied residents, other potential advantages of a higher snow service standard include fewer staff hours spent on resident complaints, less equipment damage resulting from dealing with ice rather than snow, safer roads, easier management of ice build-up on sidewalks and reduced impact of spring melt.

additional The cost would be mainly due to paying for additional contracted trucking hours to work through more average snow clearings.

That cost will be included in the proposed 2024 budget to be considered by council. If the change is approved during the budget process, council's snow and ice control policy and administrative directive would be amended in accordance with the service level change.

Asked by Councillor Stephen Dafoe if council would be presented with budget options for both 12-centimetre and 10-centimetre clearing options, Betteridge said the intention had been come forward with 12, but providing information on both options was possible.

"I wouldn't want to lose sight of that potential opportunity, given that for many years it was five," said Dafoe.

Council voted to accept the snow program update report as information.

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
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# **Proposed Resource Extraction Changes** PUBLIC HEARING – BYLAW 1607/22 Amendments to Land Use Bylaw 1385/17

In accordance with section 606 of the Municipal Government Act, Sturgeon County Council is requesting public input on new changes to proposed Bylaw 1607/22, which relates to resource extraction.

Council gave second reading to Bylaw 1607/22 on May 23, 2023. In addition to the regulations presented at the public hearing on March 15, 2023, the bylaw includes the following updates:

- Sand, gravel and clay operations and secondary processing operations would need to be at least 400 metres (quarter mile) from homes whether located in a multi lot subdivision or not.
- Silica sand and secondary processing operations would need to be at least 800 metres (half mile) from homes whether located in a multi lot subdivision or not. Silica sand is made up of at least 95 per cent silicon dioxide and less than 0.6 per cent iron oxide.

The existing and previously proposed bylaw presented on March 15, 2023, had setback distances of 400 metres between operations and single homes and 800 metres between operations and multi-lot subdivisions. The setback distances were the same for all operations, regardless of the material being mined.
