Sunrise Boutique embraces community and style

A new women's clothing store has raised a ray of sunshine on 100 Avenue. Sunrise Boutique opened recently at 10607 100 Avenue in the former Legendary Liquor location between Shell and Pizza Hut. The shop offers women's clothing and accessories in a bright, welcoming environment.

"The Sunrise Boutique was created for myself as I was looking for something to do," Sunrise Boutique owner Deb O'Donoghue explained, noting she has always been an entrepreneur and owned other businesses in the past. "I was bored at home, and I'm like,

That question led to soul-searching and crafting a list of what makes O'Donoghue happy. Coffee and sunrises were at the top of that list.

Cardiff residents return from Indigenous games with medal

The North American Indigenous Games (NAIG) is an event that celebrates the rich cultural heritage and athletic prowess of Indigenous communities across North America.

The games, held July 15-23, saw Levi Dickson (16) and Tehya Dickson (15), residents of Cardiff Echoes and students at Paul Kane, return to the area with medals.

Tehya Dickson came home with a silver medal in the 800 free, one silver medal, and one bronze medal in relays. Brother Levi came home with four medals: a bronze medal in the 50-mebackstroke, a tre bronze medal in the 200-metre backstroke, a silver medal for the 100-metre backstroke and

another for relay.

"This experience couldn't have been any better. It was surreal. I am so thankful for the memories our whole team made and how well and easily we all bonded through the week," Levi Dickson said. "I have never had more fun in my life. NAIG 2023 is definitely one for the books. I swam well, which was one huge goal, and coming home with those medals made things that much better.

Levi Dickson said after 10 years of competitive swimming, he would not be continuing in the sport but felt NAIG was the best way he could ever think of to end his years.

"It's been tough at times, but swimming and the amount I swam has taught me a lot, Levi Dickson said. "I have learned

[I thought] I can probably put something together that other women would love."

From those thoughts about what made her happiest, Sunrise Boutique was born, a woman's clothing store that is as much about community as the clothing available to customers.

"We need to bring back community. My other business always had a little sitting area and coffee," O'Donoghue said, adding that she created an area in the store for women who like to come in and sit."

Although an entrepreneur with many years of experience, selling clothing was new to her.

"I started it in my home. I was just doing open houses. I ended up with so many clothes I had to move out," O'Donoghue said with a chuckle. "I'm with the Garment Group, and it's a company where we have 25 wholesalers that they find for us."

O'Donoghue said she initially found the variety a little overwhelming but started picking stuff she loved.

"I'm going to bring stuff into the store that I love. If I love it, it's coming to the store," she said. "It's really funny how when the orders started arriving, they just all kind of went together. You could match them. You could turn outfits into it."

Both her daughter and her son's girlfriend help O'Donoghue at the store, both of whom the proprietor says have been wonderful at putting together the store's displays.

"Women are welcome to come in. We're doing some events just to keep community and have stuff for women to do," O'Donoghue said, adding a sense of community, helping small businesses, and a desire to keep things local is important to her. "If we have what they need, they'll shop local."

Avenue for a short time, the response has been great, with customers thanking O'Donoghue for bringing her type of store to town and for having great prices.

"It makes me feel good," O'Donoghue said. "It's been busy or steady."

Events like the Girls Just Want to Shop event, held July 25, are important to O'Donoghue and Sunrise Boutique, a great example of how the shop owner wants to mix retail with a sense of community.

"It's just a place to come and have fun. Have a coffee-we always have free coffee on," O'Donoghue said. "We just want it to be a warm, welcoming place."

Sunrise Boutique is open Tuesday to Friday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

"So, hopefully, I can attend more



Morinville Legion Memorial car show honours fallen soldier

The Morinville Legion Branch No. 176 held its Second Annual Memorial Car Show and Shine on Saturday, July 22. Approximately 20 vehicles were displayed in front of the Legion on 101 Street for car and truck enthusiasts.

Organizer and Morinville Legion Branch No. 176 member Mike Adams said that each year, the Legion chooses a fallen soldier.

"Last year, we chose [Corporal]NickBulger, who died in Afghanistan in 2009," Adams explained. "This year, we chose [Corporal] Ainsworth Dyer, who died in a friendly-fire incident in 2002. It is to memorialize the veteran and who they were to us, and their community."

One of the vehicles on display at the Memorial Car Show was a Bentley, driven up for the event from Mexico by Dyer's best friend Jason Campbell.

Campbell said he first met Dyer in Wainright.

"We went out that night and had some beers. It was either we were going to scrap it out or be best buddies. Thankfully we were best buddies because we would have wrecked the bar," Campbell said. "He was a big dude and a strong man. Probably one of the strongest guys I was ever in a gym with."

Although Campbell said he doesn't need an excuse to drive his 2008 Bentley, which he bought last year in Toronto with 50,000 kilometres, the real reason for the journey up from Mexico was to honour his friend's memory.

"Hopefully, he'd do the same for me, which I'm sure he would have," Campbell said.


Of the roughly 20 cars out in the summer sun as part of the memorial car show was a local vehicle that originally travelled from a far

distance.

Marlon Rakowski brought his Treasure Seeker, a 2002 Nissan Atlas fire truck, to the show.

Rakowski said he bought the decommissioned Japanese fire truck about six months ago.

"They took all the stuff off and sent it on down here," Rakowski said. "I came across a guy who bought it and couldn't keep it because he was getting into a mortgage."

The July 22 car show was Rakowski's second with the fire truck. He took the bright red vehicle to the NAPA Show and Shine during Morinville Festival Days in June.

But the Atlas is not just for sitting on the side of the road on display. Rakowski, who is active in the treasure-hunting community with his daughter Aurora, uses the truck to load all of their gear in it on their adventures seeking treasure.

"I was looking at one of the small white ones, and when this came across that we could haul the whole family in here and make noise with it, and it had room for our stuff. We can go metal detecting, magnet-fishing, rip around. We even just drive around and clean up the town trash, bottles. You got to do your part. If you are going to take treasure out of the ground, you might as well take trash. Leave it nicer than you found it."

Rakowski's fire truck took third place in the truck category at the show.

Another bright vehicle at the Memorial Show and Shine was Gerald Whitter's 1971 GMS Sierra 1500, which came from Western GM in a bright pink colour.

Whitter is the original owner, having bought the halftonne on June 8, 1971. "I just liked the colour," Whitter said, noting that he recently redid the truck in that original colour.

The unusual hue was a custom colour in that model year, only available to Canadian dealers. The inside of Whitter's truck indicates it was supposed to have been blue. Some descriptions of the rarely coloured truck indicate the GM colour was called Coral Ice.


