Morinville barbecue and open house, celebrating RCMP'S 150 years of service

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) Morinville Detachment and Sturgeon Victim Services (SVS) are uniting their efforts on September 16 for an afternoon barbecue and open house to recognize the RCMP's 150th anniversary and SVS's partnership in assisting them and the community for many years.

The event, open to everyone, occurs on Saturday, September 16, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Morinville RCMP Detachment on 101 Avenue.

In addition to hamburgers, hotdogs, potato chips and other refreshments, SVS Executive Director Lis Melvin said several displays will be set up at the event, allowing an opportunity to learn the work of the RCMP, SVS, Morinville's Bylaw Department, and even a recruiting table.

"We're going to have Safety Bear on site and an RCMP member in Red Serge to take photos with," Melvin said. "We're looking at getting one of our cruisers set up so people can look at that." She noted there may be a few additional surprises as well.

"We absolutely appreciate the communities that we serve throughout this region, and as much as we are celebrating the 150 years, we also want to celebrate the people we are serving and the partnership they are offering," Melvin said.

Mayor expresses interest in establishing a police commission for Morinville

Should Morinville have a police commission to enhance its relationship with law enforcement authorities?

Mayor Simon Boersma thinks that's worth looking into.

At town council's regular meeting on Tuesday, August 22, the mayor put forward the following motion:

"I move that the administration conduct a thorough study focusing on the political intricacies and financial implications that arise from the creation of a police commission within the town of Morinville.

"This study will enable us to gain a comprehensive understanding of the multifaceted political dynamics and financial considerations associated

with the establishment of such a commission."

Concerning his motion, Boersma stated that a police commission complements law enforcement and could provide oversight and transparency, along with enabling long-term planning.

"I think it's important that we as a community are involved, and residents are involved," he said. "We work together with the police organization to be able to create a safer community.

"Our residents have needs and I want to ensure those needs are met within our community."

Earlier in the meeting, Boersma asked Staff Sergeant Chris Palfey of the RCMP Morinville Detachment whether increased public involvement through a mechanism such as a police commission would enhance policing.

Palfey, who was at the meeting to deliver the detachment's quarterly report, said public involvement is always a good thing and that he had no issue with working with such a body.


To operate an event venue in Sturgeon County, land must be zoned as AG2 -Agriculture 2 District. The applicant is requesting the land be rezoned from AG – Agriculture to AG2 – Agriculture 2 District. If successful, they could apply to develop an event venue.

Each time land is rezoned, a bylaw is needed to amend the Land Use Bylaw and a public hearing must be held.

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
