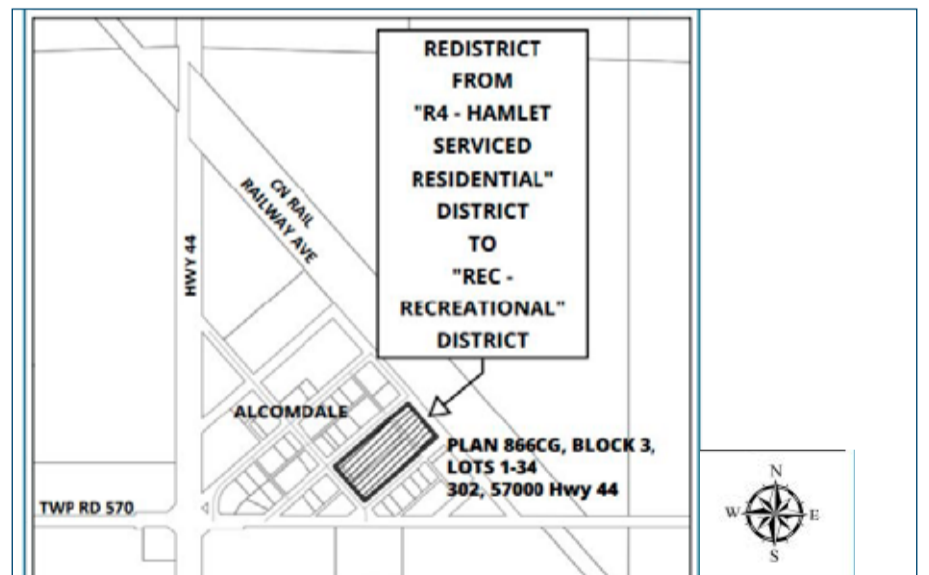

To operate RV camping and outdoor recreation facilities in Sturgeon County, land must be zoned as REC – Recreational District. The applicant is requesting the land be rezoned to REC – Recreational District, which would allow them to apply for a campground development permit.

Each time land is rezoned, a bylaw is needed to amend the Land Use Bylaw, and a public hearing must be held.

Written submissions

If making a written submission, you must include your name, state your interest in the matter (such as a County resident directly impacted by the proposed bylaw), and indicate if you are in favour of or opposed to the proposed bylaw.

Despite a few minor infractions, the game ultimately favored the Warriors, who had 58 shots on goal compared to Morinville's 36.

The Kings, now looking to regroup and learn from this challenging home opener, will have the opportunity to face the Westlock Warriors again on October 14, this time on the road at the Rotary Spirit Centre. The game is scheduled for 7:30 p.m.

While the Junior B Jets celebrate their impressive victory, the Senior AA Kings will be working hard to bounce back in their next game and put this setback behind them.

Both teams remain committed to delivering exciting hockey action to their dedicated fans in Morinville.

Fort Saskatchewan and Morinville RCMP investigate a series of break and enters

Fort Saskatchewan and Morinville RCMP are investigating after receiving multiple similar break and enters involving who police believe are the same suspects.

On August 25, 2023, Fort Saskatchewan RCMP received a report of a break in to a locked compound off 88 Avenue in Fort Saskatchewan. Fuel was taken as well a generator. A Black and Grey pick up were observed during the break in.

On September 5, 2023, Fort Saskatchewan RCMP received a report of a break in to a Card lock on Highway 15 in Lamont County. Three suspects in two trucks stole a 2012 Ford F150 pick up bearing Alberta Licence plate BFT-0602. This vehicle has yet to be recovered.

Three suspects appeared to be driving a White, Grey, and Black Chevrolet pickup trucks. One of the truck is believed to have fled an RCMP traffic stop earlier in the day.

On September 26, 2023, Fort Saskatchewan RCMP received a report of a break in to business on 88 avenue in Fort Saskatchewan. Tools were taken from the business. 4 suspects and 3 trucks were observed during the crime. This crime was against the same business as the September 8 Break in.

safety and this year's theme of "Cooking Safety Starts with You!," stated Morinville Fire Department Chief Brad Boddez. "This is a wonderful opportunity to meet your local firefighters and learn more about prevention."

Cooking Safety

Boddez and his department hope residents will also seize the opportunity to learn about this year's NFPA theme: Cooking safety starts with YOU! Pay attention to fire prevention.

"Fire Prevention Week raises awareness about the importance of fire safety. It provides an opportunity for our community to educate people about fire hazards, safety measures, and emergency preparedness. This awareness can save lives, protect property, and promote community well-being," Boddez said.

"This year's theme is "Cooking Safety Starts With YOU." Cooking remains the #1 cause of home fires and injuries, so drawing attention to critical actions that people can take to reduce risks and burns is vital to reducing injury and cooking-related deaths. Whether cooking on a stove, in the oven, on a grill, or even with an electric cooking appliance, there are a variety of things people can do to prevent burns and fires from happening."

Boddez highlighted that in today's world, full of distractions, this year's theme underscores some simple actions everyone can take. He offers the following tips:

- Watch what you heat and set a timer to remind you that you are cooking.
- Keep kids 3 feet (1 m) from the stove/grill/oven and anywhere hot foods/liquids are being served.
- Turn pot handles towards the back of the stove.
- Always keep a lid nearby; if a small fire starts, slide the lid over the pan and turn off the burner.

According to the NFPA, cooking is the leading cause of home fires, with nearly half (49 percent) of all home fires involving cooking equipment. Cooking incidents are also the leading cause of home fire injuries. Unattended cooking takes the top spot as the leading cause of home cooking fires and related fatalities. NFPA data has shown that cooking is the only major cause of fire that resulted in more fires and fire deaths in the years 2014-2018 than in 1980-1984.
