Morinville town council passes 2024 budget with 5.21% tax increase after amendments

Morinville Town Council has approved a 2024 budget that is expected to result in a 5.21% tax increase for Morinville homeowners.

The tax hike amounts to \$12.53 per month for an average residential property, valued at \$350,000.

Council made the decision at its regular meeting Tuesday, bringing a quick end to the 2024 budget development process, which began in the spring and included community engagement and several regular and special council meetings.

In a vote of six in favour to one opposed, council members passed an amended version of the operating budget brought forward on November 14 by the administration.

That budget, as proposed, would have led to a tax increase of 7.3%, with the cost for an average home valued at \$350,000 rising by \$17.76 per month next year, or \$213.08.

That proposal was rejected by the council, which supported a motion made by Councillor Stephen Dafoe calling on the administration to find \$200,000 in operational savings in the budget.

Administration came back to the meeting Tuesday with four proposed alternatives for council, the first of which was accepting the operating budget as it was, but with a reduction to an estimated monthly tax increase of \$16.48 or 6.85%.

The second alternative was a budget

St. Jean Baptiste Church designs unveiled, construction set to begin May 2024

Four years, five months, and 25 days after a fire destroyed the 113-year-old St. Jean Baptiste Church in Morinville, the bells will ring again on Christmas Day 2025. The Parish expects to break ground on a new church in May of 2024, with the church completed in time for Christmas the following year.

Parishioners and area residents got to look at the new place of worship on Thursday, Nov. 30, at an open house at St. Kateri Tekakwitha Academy.

St. Jean Baptiste Parish's Father Trini Pinca said he is excited the project is moving forward, and the Parish will soon be able to return to a church from Ecole Notre Dame, where mass has occurred since the fire.

"This has been two years and a few months since we lost our church, and of course, it has been very challenging as a pastor, especially celebrating mass in a school," Father Trini said. "They were in a church for years, and now it is in a gym. Seeing these plans moving forward, I'm excited, and I think most of our parishioners are in the same place; they are excited and hoping that our new church will come into reality."



Designs for the new St. Jean Baptiste Church show a modern church with a traditional design. The bell tower will stand 75 feet above 100 Avenue and is separated from the church proper to allow the bells to ring clearly once again.

The design displayed during the open house incorporates input from the 382 Parish and community members who provided their thoughts in 2022.

"We have listened to what our parishioners have mentioned," Trini said of the new designs. "Prior to the drawings and the plans, we made the survey, and we asked our parishioners what they wanted to see in our new church. The majority answered they wanted to see a traditional church. I think the reason for that is there is an attachment to the old church that we lost,

and having a traditional style church is one way of honouring our ancestors of Morinville who have contributed all of their lives with their talents and their resources."

Modern church with a traditional look

Christopher Filipowicz of Start Architecture said incorporating the concepts into the design was not that difficult because of the strong desire to create a modern church in terms of its architecture, technology, and techniques

without desired service level increases, resulting in a reduction of \$181,226 from total budgeted expenses of \$26,930,393 and a 5.93% rate increase.

four would achieve a net reduction of \$200,000, with a 5.25% increase, an estimated \$12.62 monthly, by cancelling the municipal census proposed for 2024, increasing the salary and benefit attrition estimate and possibly discontinuing the community bus.

A motion by Deputy Mayor Jen Anheliger to go ahead with the third alternative but without the removal of the community bus or census was amended by Councillor Stephen Dafoe to drop the census and by Councillor Scott Richardson to increase the salary and benefit attrition estimate from \$100,000

to \$140,000.

This version provides about \$200,000 in savings over the previously proposed budget, resulting in a 5.21% tax increase.

"I think with this Alternatives three budget we can reinvest in Morinville in ways that affect our service levels in ways are tangible and meaningful to our residents," said Anheliger.

"And I'm glad we have approached this budget a little bit differently because I think if we continue to short-change every budget as I feel we have with previous budgets, it's going to undermine any chance we have of moving forward with growth in a meaningful way."

The budget motion was supported by Mayor Simon Boersma, Anheliger, and Councillors Maurice St. Denis, Scott Richardson, Stephen Dafoe and Ray

White. Councillor Rebecca Balanko was opposed.

Budgeted operational expenses for 2024 include \$12,490,683 for salaries, wages, benefits and training, \$5,950,344 for material goods and utilities and \$5,366,783 for contracted and general services.

Other expenses next year include \$559,096 for the Morinville Community Library next year, unchanged from 2023, and \$113,516 for the Morinville Historical Society, up from \$110,210 the previous year.

At the meeting, Council also unanimously approved the 2024-2033 Longterm Capital Plan, which includes a total of \$4,882,000 in capital spending, primarily on roads, for next year, and, in principle, the 2024-2028 Long-term Operating Plan.



The 2024 Morinville Budget includes \$4,882,000 in capital spending, primarily on infrastructure revitalization projects. The approved budget will result in a 5.21% increase; however, Council will have opportunity in spring to lower that number depending on surplus and assessment numbers.

Sturgeon County Council requests public input on proposed Bylaw 1638/23.



A road closure bylaw is needed to close a portion of the road and a public hearing must be held. The bylaw and all feedback received during the public hearing will be forwarded to the Minister of Transportation and Economic Corridors for review and approval before Council considers approval of the road closure.

Morinville Jets take back-to-back big wins

In their sixth and seventh consecutive wins, the Morinville Junior B Jets outscored their opponents by a factor of 10-to-one.

On Friday, December 8 the Jets defeated the Spruce Grove Regals 10-1 on the road and repeated that score and outcome at home against the visiting Leduc Co-Op Riggers.

The December 8 outing saw the Jets dominating the ice, outshooting the Regals 56-16.

The Jets led the day early on, building to a 3-0 lead after one and advancing that to 5-0 before the Regals capitalized on a power play opportunity to chip back at the lead by one.

But the Jets pocketed another on the powerplay to lead 6-1.

The Jets added another four in the final frame to take the



day handily. Jacob Klassen picked up a hat trick during the game.

Sunday, December 10 was a repeat of Friday's efforts, with the Jets outshooting the Riggers 60-22.

Leading the Riggers 5-0 at the end of one, the Jets pocketed another three in the middle frame to create an insurmountable 8-0 lead heading into the final frame. Although the Riggers pocketed one on the powerplay early in the third period, the Jets answered back with another two goals to mirror their Friday night score.

The back-to-back wins give the Jets a 16-6-0 record this season, elevating

them to second place in the Capital Junior Hockey League's West Division, eight points behind the St. Albert Merchants.

Although the Jets are only one point ahead of the North Edmonton Red Wings, they sit four games behind them.

The closest contender for second place competition is the Beverly Warriors, who have also played 22 games this season and are just two points behind the Jets.

The Morinville Jets played two more games before the Christmas break: a road game against the Wetaskiwin Icemen on Sunday, December 17, and a homeice game against the Spruce Grove Regals on Tuesday, December 19, at the Morinville AAA Arena. Game time is 8 p.m. Results were not available by our press deadline.

Fort Saskatchewan RCMP warn public of 'Emergency Scam'

Fort Saskatchewan RCMP are advising the public that there has been an increase in the number of "Emergency Scams" reported to the Detachment this month. These scams are referred to as Emergency Scams, or sometimes "Grandparent" or "Grandchild" scams.

These scams often involve a phone call being placed to the victim claiming a loved one is in trouble with the courts or law enforcement and a payment is needed to help them. The suspects will often pretend to be a police officer, judge. or family member. Suspects will usually ask for cash, however more recently they have been asking for payment by Bitcoin.

Fort Saskatchewan RCMP want to remind citizens of the following:

- Bail is always paid in person at a courthouse or correctional centre.
- Never send money to anyone you

- If a person claims to be a police officer or judge, call that police service or court house directly to confirm the situation – police and courts will never ask for any form of payment.
- Never give out personal information over the phone or online to someone you don't know - the police or courts will not ask for personal information over the phone.




Sturgeon Composite High School



but one that is traditional in its appearance, character, and spirit.

"It is very reminiscent of what it had been initially, which was the desire to begin with," Filipowicz said. "From that perspective, the modern part of it more applies to the techniques and materials we are using, which are quite different from the original design. Otherwise, aesthetically, it is reminiscent in many aspects to what the original church was."

The architects designed the new church in two phases: the naive or church proper and a welcome centre, an additional section for overflow and functions. versus available funding will determine if both get built for 2025 or the church alone gets built.

At full build-out, the facility will be 8,500 square feet, 400 square feet smaller than the original church. However, there will be some notable differences in scale and size. Seating capacity in the naive is approximately 292 seats, 300 fewer than the 600 in the original church. When built, overflow in the welcoming centre would add another 200 seats to the church.

A folding petition separating the naive from the welcoming centre would give the church additional capacity and serve as a place to hold events, including wedding and funeral receptions and social functions. The phase two welcoming centre would also have a kitchen to support the various functions.

The Bells Will Ring Again

Building Committee Chair Ron Cust said the bells will ring from St. Jean Baptiste Church and be heard throughout town as they once were. He is pleased with the current design.

"What we really have we're building a new church, but we are using the past," Cust said, adding the architects had brought nine designs for the project over time, which did not quite meet the mark. "Then he came with the one that is more what you see now, and we said, 'Now, you've got it!' It's modern. The bells are open. We're getting antique bells from Quebec that are going to be shipped here to replicate the [original] bells.

Another difference between the former and new church is in the steeple that will house those bells. The

former steeple, which the church repaired in a significant renovation project a few years before the church's destruction, stood at 101 feet. The new steeple tower will be 75 feet high but not connected to the church.

Cust said this is by design. "The bell tower has been separated from the church by an amount so that we can totally ring them. They'll ring like the old ones."

The Building Committee Chair went on to say that while the church loses some seating in the naive, they will, on completion, gain other things. "We've got a meeting area that holds 30 people. We've got a children's liturgy area. And we have an area dedicated to the choir and a chapel," Cust said, noting he was happy to receive additional feedback from those who were both happy and unhappy with the design at the open house.

"The Parishioners have had presentations over the last year showing various aspects of the design as it evolved. In our survey, and along the way, they told us what they wanted, and we've complied with most of that. They received the

unveiling of a very close to final concept on Thursday night."

What remains to be determined is whether the Parish will build the welcoming centre now or later. The project was designed as two phases to avoid being caught by surprise and ensure that whatever is constructed now can be sustained now and into the future with existing parishioners. Whatever is built, one of the critical things for those involved is that the bells of St. Jean Baptiste Church will ring again, and those coming home to Morinville will again see the steeple towering above the horizon.

"We're designing it so the lights come up through the steeple. You're going to see it for miles around again," Cust said. "And you're going to hear the bells. They're not going to be clanging. They're going to be ringing."

Now that the designs are nearing final completion, the project will go out to tender this winter with an anticipated May 2024 start.


