Local artist's work on display at the Museum

Fred Bahr moved to Morinville three years ago to be close to his family and is enjoying his time in the community. The retired laboratory scientist and coroner has been painting using mixed media for more than four decades.

"I entered university in a fine arts program and then realized that unless I wanted to be a teacher, I couldn't sustain myself," Bahr said. "So, I ended up going into science, but always, art was in the back of my mind."

Later, Bahr was gifted ten art lessons from a realtor who had sold his home. That gift of oil painting lessons got Bahr back into his art.

Bahr then attended

art classes at the University of Saskatchewan and even went on to teach art in Prince Albert at the community level.

"You start out with a blank piece of paper, and you end up with something from your mind, but you don't have it totally clarified," Bahr says of his love of art.

"It's that inner eye within you. It gives you the creativity to make each art piece different."

Bahr started with oils and moved on to watercolours, which the artist says are far easier to clean up, mainly when working in the field.

"I'm from Northern Saskatchewan. The oil got a little messy when the mosquitos attacked you."

The artist is not

partial to human figures and portrait work because he believes the level of detail required affects his creativity. His preference is to paint outdoor

scenes, particularly old churches.

"I did a lot of churches because people get married in a church or baptized in a church, and that was always a

plus," he said.

"Often, people who do photography take a front end of the church. I have a tendency to go to the back end and view it from a

different direction. It just gives a different perspective of the building."

The Morinville Community Library hopes those who enjoy romance novels will consider coming out to the library to discuss the genre at their Shelf Indulgence Book Club, which meets on the last Friday of the month.

Shelf Indulgence is one of three book clubs the library is involved with and joins the Between the

Covers Book Club, which deals with contemporary and historical fiction, and the Rendez-Vous Book Club, where Rendez-Vous Club members select the books.

The new book club is designed for readers 18 and older and Library Program Coordinator Jessica Sheppard, who runs the club with colleague Julia Bunt, are hoping romance lovers will attend.

"The fun thing about romance is there are so many different sub-genres of romance. There's fantasy romance; there's science fiction, contemporary romance," Sheppard said.

"There's just a bunch of different genres, so we kind of wanted to highlight that and get something going for romance book lovers."

PUBLIC NOTICE – Bylaw 1640/23

Assessment of manufactured homes in a manufactured home community.

In accordance with the Municipal Government Act and the Sturgeon County Public Notification Bylaw, Sturgeon County Council is requesting public input on proposed Bylaw 1640/23.

This Bylaw seeks to bring the approach to property assessment for designated manufactured homes into compliance with the Municipal Government Act and proposes to designate the owner of a manufactured home community as the assessed person for a designated manufactured home in the community. This has been the practice in Sturgeon County for almost two decades.

Bylaw 1640/23 is required because changes to the zoning for manufactured home communities in Land Use Bylaw 1385/17 resulted in the current system not being legislatively compliant. It is important to note that property assessment values are not affected by this Bylaw.

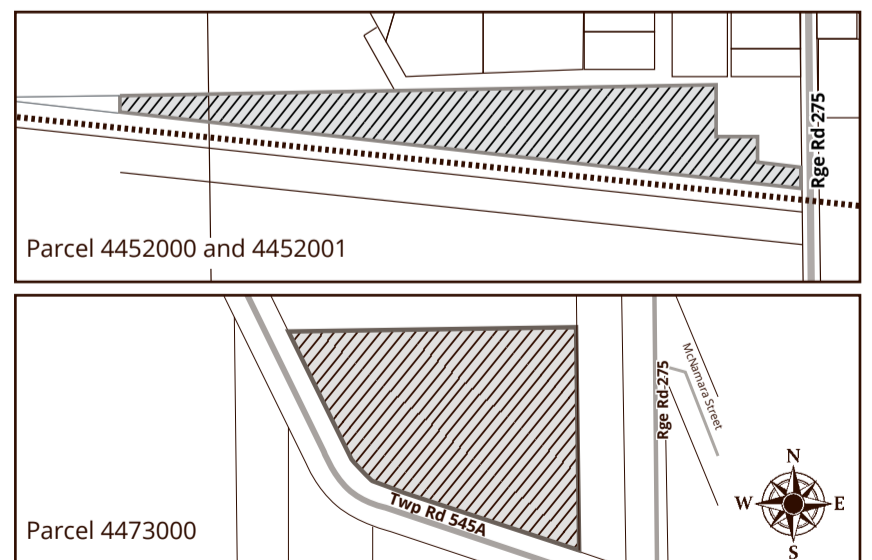
Right of Petition

Unless a petition of the electors of Sturgeon County is received, Council may consider passing proposed Bylaw 1640/23.

The proposed Bylaw can be examined on the Sturgeon County website at www.sturgeoncounty.ca or between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday in the office of the Legislative Advisor, Sturgeon County Centre, 9613 100 Street, Morinville, Alberta.

A person wishing to file a petition in respect of the proposed Bylaw must do so in accordance with Part 7 of the Municipal Government Act and should consult the Alberta Municipal Affairs online publication Petition to council information for Albertans, elected officials and municipal officers. A petition of electors must be filed with Legislative Services in person between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday, in the office of the Legislative Advisor, Sturgeon County Centre, 9613 100 Street, Morinville, Alberta. **A petition for a vote of electors on proposed Bylaw 1640/23 must be filed no later than March 20, 2024 at 4:30 p.m.**

has had the opportunity to showcase his work many times and uses his art to help the community raise funds.

"The community I belonged to always had a need for money," Bahr explained. "Our art club teamed up with the local Kiwanis Club, and they would sponsor an art gala for the community where everybody would come together."

Those ticketed events would raise funds for the community, with proceeds on art sales split between the artist and the cause.

"We raised hundreds of thousands of dollars and melded the community together in that whole process, which is going to this day," Bahr said.

It is something the

80-year-old artist wants to replicate in Morinville. The local artist recently donated a painting to Fusion Thrift Shoppe as a silent auction fundraiser for the store's expansion grand opening and said he plans to continue using art to raise community funds, hopefully on a larger scale as he did in Saskatchewan.

Bahr currently has several pieces on display at the Musée Morinville Museum as part of their commitment to displaying the works of local artists.

The Musée Morinville Museum is open from noon to 5 p.m. Wednesday through Saturday. The Museum is located at the back of St. Jean Baptiste Park in downtown Morinville.

Sturgeon County Council requests public input on proposed Bylaw 1638/23.

Cando Rail & Terminals has requested a partial closure of Range Road 222 to facilitate the expansion of the business. The closure is between Township Road 555 and Township Road 560. As a result of the proposed road closure, Cando proposes to develop a bypass around its site.

A road closure bylaw is needed to close a portion of the road and a public hearing must be held. The bylaw and all feedback received during the public hearing will be forwarded to the Minister of Transportation and Economic Corridors for review and approval before Council considers approval of the road closure.

Sheppard said romance book readers are hesitant to discuss their green of preference due to the stigma that exists surrounding the genre.

"A lot of people don't think there is any substance to romance and that it is all just fluff, but there are actually some really good romance books out there," Sheppard said.

"We just recently read a book by Emily Henry, and she incorporates something that is called Chick Lit - essentially women's

fiction with romance. We discussed it. There's a lot of family dynamics involved in the book. It was just really fun to have a group of people who really like romance books."

Sheppard said both she and co-organizer Julia Bunt enjoy romance books and find it nice to get together with others who enjoy the genre to share that enthusiasm.

The monthly in-person gathering is coupled with a discord server where the

group shares humorous romance-themed memes and videos and offers book recommendations.

The group votes on which book will be read and discussed at upcoming gatherings.

Sheppard said that although the group is predominantly women, men who enjoy romance books are also welcome.

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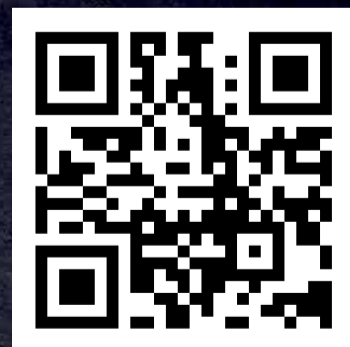

Town of Bon Accord Municipal Development Plan (Bylaw 2023-10)

Pursuant to Sections 216.4, 606, and 692 of the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.A. 2000, c. M-26, as amended, Town of Bon Accord Council hereby gives notice of its intention to consider Bylaw No. 2023-10, the Town of Bon Accord Municipal Development Plan.

The purpose of the Bylaw is to repeal and replace the Town's existing Municipal Development Plan, Bylaw 2016-08, as amended.

The Municipal Development Plan is a high-level planning document that guides future land use growth and development in the Town.

The Municipal Development Plan:

1. Includes information about the community's history, current demographics, and environmental features;
2. Includes mapping information to identify areas with development constraints;
3. Identifies preferred future land use areas for residential, commercial, industrial, and community/recreational land uses;
4. Establishes goals and objectives for land use and development;
5. Establishes policies affecting:
 - a. Cooperation with agencies and neighbouring municipalities;
 - b. The manner and proposals for future development;
 - c. All land use and development activities in the Town; and
 - d. Development within the specific future land use areas;

Section 230 of the *Municipal Government Act*, RSA 2000, c M-26, requires that a public hearing on a proposed bylaw must be held before the second reading of the bylaw. First reading of Bylaw 2023-10 occurred on Tuesday, December 5, 2023.

THEREFORE, PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT pursuant to Sections 216.4, 606, and 692 of the *Municipal Government Act* a public hearing to consider the proposed Bylaw will be held in-person at the Town Office.
