New RCMP Commander brings vision and experience to Morinville

Morinville's new RCMP Detachment Commander, Staff Sergeant Darcy McGunigal, brings a wealth of experience and a strong vision for community collaboration to his new role.

With a career spanning various postings and leadership roles within the RCMP, McGunigal's approach to policing focuses on the community and ensuring that the detachment's positive work is visible to the

public. McGunigal has seized the opportunity, spending the first two weeks as Detachment Commander making the rounds and meeting with community partners, including the region's municipalities, Alexander First Nation, Jessica Martel Memorial Foundation, Sturgeon Victim Services and others to seek their input and concerns.

"My vision is to come up with a plan that addresses and takes

all of those concerns into consideration," McGunigal said, noting the initial weeks at Morinville Detachment have been positive and that he can already sense immense support in the community. "I find a lot of engagement, a lot of interest. They really want to work towards and progress towards the same goals that I have in mind, which is great. At the end of the day, it comes down to full collaboration and work between the community and the

Detachment, all one working together."

Two decades plus of experience

Originally from La Ronge, Saskatchewan, McGunigal moved to Regina when he was 15. His journey into policing began at 18 with a chance encounter with a recruiting officer for the Regina Police Service while working for the City of Regina in the city's storage and inventory facilities. He was intrigued by the recruiting officer's explanation of police

work and applied to the Regina Police Service and the RCMP in 2002.

The application process with the RCMP proceeded swiftly, and at the age of 23, McGunigal embarked

on his career with the force.

His first posting was in Warman, Saskatchewan, where he served as a constable for five years, from July 2002

The twelfth annual Morinville Fire Department's Combat Challenge happening soon!

Rushing into a burning building to save lives and fight fires is a serious enterprise requiring a proper mixture of skill and stamina, something few people see close up. This weekend's Morinville Festival Days provides attendees with the unique opportunity to see firefighters from Morinville and the area putting those skills to the test during the Morinville Fire Department's Combat Challenge.

The Morinville Fire Department is once again hosting its annual Firefighters Combat Challenge. This year's event is on Saturday, June 15, from

11 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Morinville Leisure Centre as part of Morinville Festival Days.

For four hours on Saturday, firefighters will go through an obstacle course that tests many of their firefighting skills and demonstrates that the

occupation is challenging, even with countless hours of training.

Morinville Fire Chief Brad Boddez said the purpose of the obstacle course is to simulate anything job-related.

"I think it is good for the public to see what

we do. They will see how we do the hose advance and what it takes to do the job that we have to do when we are called upon," Boddez said. "Even though it is a bit of a sporting format, it is reflective of the things that we have to actually do when we fight fires."

Dressed in full gear, competitors start the course by carrying a packed fire hose on their back up four flights of stairs, where they drop the pack and use a rope to haul another bundled fire hose from the ground up to the top floor. Upon completing that task, each firefighter must return to ground

Keep an eye out: Morinville property tax notices are on their way

Over 4,000 property tax notices were mailed or emailed last week.

Property owners should expect their 2024 Property Tax Notice to arrive soon.

It is the responsibility of property owners to contact the municipality if they do not receive their notice.

Any outstanding balance of property taxes after Friday, June 28 are subject to a 7.5% penalty.

A further 9% penalty is applied to any outstanding balances on January 1, 2025.

There are several convenient payment options available to residents to pay their tax bill including the monthly Tax installment program.

In addition to paying online or in-person through your bank, there are also in-person and mail options available. Learn more about these options on the Morinville website.

2024 Tax Rate Bylaw

On Tuesday, April 23, 2024, Morinville Town Council approved second and third reading of Bylaw 8/2024, Morinville's Property Tax Bylaw.

Approval of 3rd Reading included an amendment to the total amount raised by general municipal taxation to

\$13,023,717.

Council originally approved the 2024 Budget with an estimated 5.25% tax increase.

In March 2024, the final aggregate assessment figures were confirmed to be higher than original estimates, allowing Council to reduce the tax rate down to 4.45%. During recent deliberations of the Property Tax Bylaw, Council allocated surpluses from the 2023 financial year to operational costs in 2024 allowing the tax rate to be further reduced to 3.38%.

This means a home valued at \$350,000 would have originally incurred an estimated increase of \$12.53 per month. Based on the approved tax rate bylaw, this increase is now \$8.13.

For a commercial property valued at \$650,000 in Morinville the estimated increase will be \$100.50 per month.

Mean Girls production by Four Winds School impresses audience

In their second theatrical outing in as many years, Four Winds Public School took on Mean Girls, running four shows over two days on May 29 and 30 at the Morinville Community Cultural Centre.

The show featured a cast of 21 Performing Arts Academy students who were assigned their parts

in January and have diligently rehearsed their lines, songs, and choreography since February.

Like the film that inspired it, Mean Girls Junior delves into the complex world of high school politics. The show's narrative revolves around Cady Heron (Arrow Hurrie), a newcomer to the social scene who manages to infiltrate the notorious Plastics

clique led by the cunning Regina George (Chelsea Thiffault).

until August 2007. Living in a small community outside Warman called Osler, McGunigal recalls being one of the few officers to live in the community.

"The community really embraced me even just for showing up, just for being there," he recalled of his early days in policing. "So, it really encouraged me to get involved in the community and planted that seed early-seeing the benefits of positive community involvement. That's something that I've carried with me right through the ranks as I've moved on to other posts working in cities as Watch Commander, being in charge of operations and eventually running detachments."

McGunigal has accumulated a lot of experience over 22 years of policing.

He was Acting Detachment Commander in Kitscoty in 2011 and Beaumont in 2012, following which he served the RCMP and the community of Coronation as Detachment Commander from 2014 to 2017.

He also concurrently served as an Advisory NCO for nine different detachments between Edmonton and Lloydminster from 2016 to 2017.

McGunigal, who lives in Sturgeon County with his blended family of five children, has spent the past six years before his new Morinville posting in HR at RCMP K Division in Edmonton.

The Staff Sergeant says he feels fortunate to have enjoyed every posting during his two-decade-plus policing career. However, running a

detachment has been the most fulfilling.

McGunigal sees Morinville Detachment's extensive coverage area as a challenge that is not unique to rural Alberta. Morinville's top cop also sees it as an opportunity because of its size and the number of diverse partners who assist in the detachment's work.

"The nature of our work is driven to respond to criminal activity and respond to requests for assistance and service to the public," he said, adding that while that is the primary function, police officers mustn't lose sight that there's another half to that job.

"We don't have to be limited to interacting with the public under challenging circumstances, under difficult circumstances. A lot of times when we're dealing with people in that kind of context, they're experiencing the worst day of their lives. It doesn't have to be limited to that. We can attend the schools. We can attend the public functions – the summer parades, the community events – and have that positive interaction with the community. It serves us as well as it serves the public."

One of McGunigal's key priorities is developing a media strategy to ensure that the positive results achieved by the Detachment are communicated effectively to the public, including thefts, vandalism and other areas of interest and impact to the public.

"I see first-hand the good work that is being done by these police officers," McGunigal said. "We do need to make the public aware of the good work that we're doing and the results that we're achieving."

level, ensuring their feet touch each step in the four-storey scaffold structure. On the ground, competitors drive a concrete block a distance of one foot using a sledgehammer, an exercise replicating the exertion

needed for a forced entry. Next, the firefighter manoeuvres around a set of pylons to grab a fully charged fire hose, drag it back across the arena floor obstacle course and let loose on a target. The firefighters then exchange the heavy hose for an equally heavy rescue

dummy, dragging the 200-pound dead weight across the arena floor lot to reach the finish line. Competitors will showcase their skills in three divisions: Men's, Women's and Master's categories. Boddez said the Department is particularly excited about this

year's event because it is the biggest Combat Challenge in the Department's 12 years of hosting.

This year's event has a full roster of competitors at 52, slightly topping 2023's total, which had been their best in the event's history. "There is an incredible representation from around the province," Boddez said. "We have 15 different towns and cities coming. Everywhere from within our own region with Morinville, Sturgeon and Legal to Hinton, Beaumont, Spruce Grove, Lac La Biche and Bonnyville. They're coming from

all over." Boddez attributed the event's increasing success to word spreading among the firefighters. "It's such a great event for the camaraderie between the departments," he said, noting Hinton has attended for most of the 12 years the event has run. They really enjoy it, and I think the word just kind of spreads. We just keep building year after year after year."

Boddez and the other organizers within the Morinville Fire Department hope to see a packed house once again for this year's competition. "We love

the support. We had a very good showing last year," he said. "It's good for them to see how well we work with other departments and the volunteers. I have over 43 volunteers just to run that show. We have departments in the area that come out and help with the setup and tear down. In Morinville, we are lucky to have a large roster, but we are happy to have that extra helping hand from some of the other departments that come and participate.

The event will run from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday, June 15. Admission is free.
