Morinville RCMP launches Summer Road Safety Initiative

Morinville The RCMP Detachment, in collaboration with Enforcement Services from Sturgeon County and the Town of Morinville, initiated their summer road safety enforcement plan with a concerted operation on Thursday, June 20.

The operation targeted critical areas, including speed limits, cell phone use, and seatbelt compliance, to enhance road safety in the Morinville area.

RCMP Morinville Staff Sergeant, Darcy McGunigal, said the Detachment will continue to work to reduce traffic-related collisions and incidents throughout the summer.

"Strategies

include joint operations with our local enforcement partners targeting provincial traffic violations as well as police-operated impaired driving check stops," Mc-Gunigal said.

"These operations will be scheduled at times and locations designed to have the maximum level of effectiveness."

However, drivers shouldn't expect advance notice, as RCMP will not disclose times and locations to ensure a practical impact.

The local efforts tie in well with the Alberta Traffic Safety Calendar, which identifies a different traffic focus each month. June's focus was on commercial vehicle safety, July is impaired driving, and August's is on new

drivers. Statistics show that summer is a key time for collisions in the province, which is no

different in the Morinville Detachment area. "Morinville Detachment typically responds to five or six injury collisions in the summer months," McGunigal said.

"During the summer of 2022, those numbers roughly doubled. Subsequent enforcement efforts and priority planning in 2023 successfully reduced this rate back to our previous levels, but we are determined not to let our guard down. Morinville Detachment will continue these efforts in 2024 and beyond to prevent another spike in injury-related collisions.'



Alberta Health Services: Simple precautions can protect you from heat and sun

Albertans are encouraged to take some simple precautions so they can safely enjoy activities when it's hot and sunny this summer.

Many factors can cause heat stress, such as UV radiation, temperature and humidity.

Make sure to check on loved ones, especially those who may be socially isolated or live in housing without air conditioning, to see how they are coping. Older adults, infants, pregnant women and people with underlying health conditions are at greatest risk from extreme heat.

stroke Heat is а life-threatening medical emergency, which requires medical attention as soon as possible. Symptoms of heat stroke include confusion, severe restlessness or anxiety, nausea and vomiting, fast heart rate, lack of sweat, dizziness, fainting, or unconsciousness.

For emergencies, visit your nearest local emergency department or call 911.

Here are a few ways to

avoid the heat this summer:

Keep cool at home:

 Close your blinds or curtains and use awnings and shutters.

 Do activities early or later in the day when it is cooler.

• Use air conditioning if possible. If you don't have air conditioning, go into the basement or visit a cool location, such as a shopping centre or library.

 Take frequent cool showers or baths and apply a cold towel to your neck.

Keep cool when outdoors:

• Plan a place to take breaks in the shade to cool off.

• Drink lots of water and other non-alcoholic, non-caffeinated beverages to stay hydrated.

• Avoid strenuous activities if possible.

Protect your skin from the sun:

Wear a broad-rimmed hat, long-sleeved shirts and pants that cover skin with UV-protective-labelled clothing.

 Be aware certain medications increase the health risks from extreme heat exposure. Find out if your medication causes you to be more sensitive to sunlight or heat stress.


· Choose a water-resistant sunscreen that has a broad-spectrum sun protection factor (SPF) of 30 or higher. Apply sunscreen generously 20 minutes before going outside and reapply frequently and especially after swimming, strenuous exercise or toweling off.

Pay attention to your pets:

• Make sure they have fresh water and keep them out of the heat as much as possible.

 Never leave a pet unattended in a vehicle.

• Brush your pets coat to

Early budget discussions shape Morinville's financial priorities for 2025

Development of the Town of Morinville 2025 budget moved forward at the Tuesday, June 25 council meeting, at which several council members put forward items they would like to see taken into account in its preparation.

The discussion followed up on a kickoff budget session during the May 14 council meeting.

At that meeting, Financial Services Manager Travis Nosko provided council with information about challenges and opportunities involved in putting together Budget 2005 and prompted council members to consider items they would like included or addressed early on.

reiterated Nosko that message at the June 25 meeting.

"The earlier council identifies projects, initiatives or service level changes the

more time it allows attend and mileage administration for to complete research and due diligence, which in turn better prepares council for making budgetary decisions," he stated.

Following the discussion, Council passed a motion by Councillor Maurice St. Denis aimed at increasing resident participation in the budget process by live-streaming the September 21 budget deliberations in venues such as the MLC, MCCC or Rendez-Vous Centre.

Councillor Jen Anheliger put forward motions directing administration to bring forward reports on increasing 2025 budget funding for FCSS complex cases and barrier-free child and youth programming.

Councillor Stephen Dafoe moved that administration be directed to examine council per diems and other line items (such as how many external meetings councillors

allowances) to identify where reductions could be made to reflect what is actually being used.

"It's to take a look at where we can roll back, and in conjunction with that, look at where we might need to increase," he said.

All of these motions passed unanimously. In addition, council dealt with budget-related motions put forward by Councillor Ray White through the notice of motion process.

White moved that council direct administration to "change the capital plan/budget by moving the replacement of the Infrastructure Services Building from 2027 to 2029. The savings that will result will be put into road and sidewalk rehabilitation."

He also put forward three motions directing administration to change the capital plan/budget to include road and

sidewalk rehabilitation along specific streets in old town Morinville in 2026.

coun-Several cil members were uneasy with this straight-out directive to administration to change the capital plan priorities without hearing their rationale and the implications of such a change.

There was a possibility of the motion being defeated – with the result that the subject could not be brought up again.

So, despite his position and that of Dafoe that administration

should have provided information so that the motion could be discussed and voted on at the meeting, White agreed to

amend the motion. Council passed the amended motion directing administration to bring forward a report on the proposed replacement Infrastructure Services Building.


White withdrew his other motions when told that the old town Morinville area will be dealt with in the next five-year cycle of road and sidewalk rehabilitation, commencing in 2026.

Council also approved updates to its calendar.

Two dedicated budget meetings in September were reduced to one, with the first draft of the 2025 budget to be presented to council at a full-day meeting on Saturday, September 21.

A dedicated budget meeting was added for October 15 to ensure there is enough time for council deliberations and direction to administration.


