



Fall Classic 2024: Golfing for a cause to support Morinville Adopt-a-Family

Golf enthusiasts and community supporters will gather for the 2024 Fall Classic Golf Tournament at Goose Hummock Golf Resort on Saturday, Sept. 14. Registration starts at 11 a.m., with a shotgun start at 1 p.m. The event features golf, skill competitions, and various activities, all supporting the Morinville Adopt-a-Family initiative, which provides food and presents for families during Christmas. This year's tournament costs \$150 per golfer/ \$600 per foursome, including a cart, driving range and a post-tournament meal.

This year's tournament honours the memory of Willa Tomchuk, who passed away in April of this year after a courageous battle with brain cancer.

Andrew and Monique Webb organize the annual fundraising golf tournament. Joining the Webb family in sponsoring the fundraiser this year is Seven 96 Electrical and Blare Borle Mortgage Architects. All involved are hoping to see the fairways and putting greens

full of golfers looking to support the cause.

"We've always tried to organize ways to help others in the communities we've called home, often for causes that one or both of us have had the need for ourselves in our past," said organizer Andrew Webb in an email interview with MorinvilleNews.com. "We've tried to help out with the Adopt-A-Family program for several years now, helping with wrapping presents and delivering items to their recipients."

Webb said that when he and Monique decided to start the annual golf tournament, they reached out to Sarah Hall of the Morinville Adopt-a-Family Program to see if there was interest.

"It was at a time in our lives when we felt we didn't have the funds to donate much," Webb recalled. "We had the desire to do more than what we could afford to do, so we tried to think of a way that we could help in a big way despite our own small budget. That's when the idea of the golf tournament was born."

Morinville Seed Cleaning Plant seeks \$1 million for facility upgrades

The Morinville Seed Cleaning Plant is launching a \$1 million fundraising campaign to modernize its aging facility and enhance its operations.

This initiative addresses financial challenges and improves efficiency, including updating systems and reducing truck unloading times.

A long history in the area

In the spring of 1948, farmers and municipal councillors met to address the municipality's growing weed infestation, traced to the planting of improperly cleaned or uncleaned grain.

Built in the mid-seventies with funding from Sturgeon county and the Government of Alberta, the Morinville Seed Cleaning Co-op Ltd. became a co-operative owned by member shareholders who were bona fide farmers.

The new facility replaced an aging location, governed by an agreement that continued until two years ago.

Under the agreement, the County

was responsible for overseeing its investment, had the right to seize assets if the plant was mismanaged, and was obligated to provide contingency or maintenance loans if and when needed.

Morinville Seed Cleaning Co-op Ltd. Board Chair Ward Middleton said Sturgeon County desired to end the arrangement a few years ago.

The province was also willing to exit the agreement as well.

Independence raises challenges

The previous county agreement stated that on dissolution or divestiture of the business, municipal

and provincial funds would have had to be repaid at 1% above prime back to 1975, which would have consumed most of the property's value.

Mutually ending the agreement removed this obligation and a guaranteed creditor for the seed plant.

Exiting the agreement with Sturgeon County meant the board had to make some decisions: sell the property, partner with another entity, or rejuvenate the existing facility and business.

The membership decided to pursue the latter option.

"This is a democratic process, and those people who were

willing to come to the meeting of the membership would like to have a place that will stay and continue to be here because it is a key part of independence or sovereignty for a farm business," Middleton said.

"It's the cog that allows them to retain, save the seed, clean it and replant it."

On their own, and now wholly owning the facility, the cooperative membership had the challenge of finding their funding elsewhere.

Upgrades needed

Despite its age, the Seed Cleaning Plant offers significant

value for those member shareholders, the property being adjacent to the CN rail line.

However, the outdated facility struggles to handle the modern logistics of large, super B tractor-trailers, and its financial stability has been a concern in recent years.

Middleton contrasted the Westlock Seed Cleaning Plant, which he said has thrived with a robust business model.

Managed effectively for the past 35 years, it attracts large seed growers by offering cleaning services, storage, and even reselling options.

This success has led many local seed growers to favour Westlock, leaving smaller facilities like the Morinville Seed Cleaning Plant grappling with losing business and the challenges of

maintaining an older plant.

Looking to raise \$1 million for facility upgrades

The board aims to raise \$1 million for facility revitalization, potentially more if needed.

The funds will support business development, refurbish systems such as the dust collection setup, and enhance operational efficiency.

For instance, replacing the current unloading system

- which takes 1 hour and 40 minutes for a Super B truck - with a bucket elevator could cut unloading time in half.

These upgrades seek to attract larger farmers back to the facility.

The Morinville facility remains one of the few in the province with a zero-tolerance policy for Fusarium, a pathogenic disease affecting cereal grains.

Farmers must test their grain at a lab to ensure it is free from

this fungal contamination, underscoring the plant's commitment to maintaining high standards of seed cleaning.

"Going forward, if you're a member, we are now going to cover the cost of that testing, which is going to cost us out-of-pocket," Middleton said, noting they hope the expense makes the Morinville plant an attractive place to do business, which in turn could result in expanding their customer base.

The facility currently has about 200 customers. "My hope is that we will have rekindled an engaged customer base who are members."

The Morinville Seed Cleaning Plant will seek investors starting this August, and the cooperative will strive to make the opportunities competitive with those available from the bank.

"Some of those investment options are only available to the members, the actual

cooperative members, but some are open to the wider community and looking for people who might have more of a social conscience interest in maintaining some of that local food security," Middleton said.

The Webbs didn't know what to expect that first year in 2017 but were excited to have 36 golfers attend, raising roughly \$1300. The event has grown considerably, and last year's tee-off saw 144 golfers raising \$16,000 for the cause. "We are over the moon," Webb said.

However, the Webbs are among many to be over the moon about the results over the past eight years. The organization that benefits has been pleased with the assistance.

"The Fall Classic has become an essential fundraiser for Morinville Adopt-a-Family," said Adopt-a-Family head organizer Sarah Hall. "The funds raised help us support between 30 and 40 families each

season and provide almost half of our fundraised dollars year over year. Without the tournament, I simply don't know how we would have provided for the families we have and do."

Co-organizer Monique Webb said there are several reasons to sign up for this year's tournament, but perhaps the most important is what golfers have to say.

"The main reasons we hear participants say why they come out are a) they love the cause and want to help us raise money for them, and b) it's so much fun," Monique Webb said. "We try to keep it light and easy and just a fun day out. We also want to give members of the community an opportunity to help out a great cause and enjoy each other's company at the same time."

She went on to say

that trying to help highlight Morinville and area businesses connect has been an added bonus.

"It's been great to help highlight what awesome businesses we have and how giving the owners are," Webb said. "It's fun to share their generosity with the community."

There are sponsors with mini-games, sample giveaways and proximity contests throughout the course, a great hole-in-one prize, raffle draws, silent auction items, and a 50/50 poker run. Camping is also available for booking on-site.

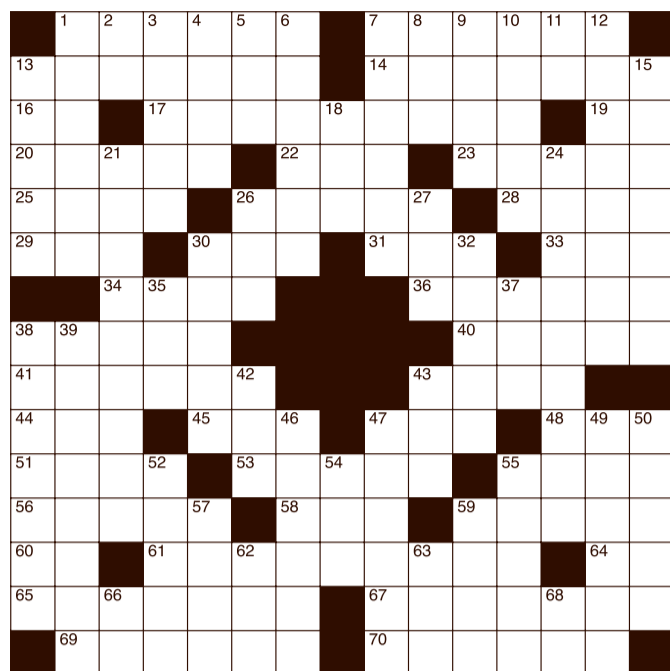

Alberta RCMP provides tips to help curb auto theft

Summer is a busy time as everyone rushes to enjoy to the weather while they can.

During these times we often don't follow our usual routines, spending much more time away from home and driving to our next destination.

The Alberta RCMP wants to remind everyone on how to protect their belongings.

Don't let the fun distract you - protect yourself against theft of, and from, vehicles.

In 2023 there were 8,710 auto thefts in Alberta RCMP jurisdictions; there have been 3,932 in the first six months of this year.

Trucks are the most commonly stolen vehicle each year.

To help prevent auto thefts here are some tips to help keep your vehicle and belongings safe while you enjoy your summer vacations:

- Always lock your vehicle, even if you are just running into the store to grab something quickly.

- Make sure that all windows are closed when you leave your vehicle.

- Park your vehicle within sight and in a well-lit area.

- If possible, park your vehicle in a locked garage. Otherwise, try to park it such that it can't be easily moved by an opportunistic thief.

- Never leave keys or garage door openers in your vehicle. Garage door openers can be stolen, along with personal identifying documents, and used to identify and enter your home.

- Ensure that personal belongings, especially important documents, are not stored in your vehicle.

- Remove loose change and valuables.

These items can be enticing to criminals.

No one is immune to auto theft, but practicing auto theft safety can help you avoid becoming a victim.

This August the RCMP will be using #AutoRoutine to provide information on how to keep your vehicles safe this summer.

After he retired, he volunteered with numerous local organizations and charities, including the Morinville Historical and Cultural Society, the Musée Morinville Museum, the Morinville Rendez-Vous Centre, and the Centralta Tourism Society. For many years, members of the Rendez-Vous Centre benefited from his wisdom and expertise at weekly bridge lessons which he organized.

Lucien was an active member of l'Association canadienne-française de l'Alberta (ACFA). In 2014, he was honoured and recognized as a member emeritus of the Ordre des sages (Recognition of Elders) for his contributions to Alberta's francophone community. Amongst his activities with the ACFA community, he will be fondly remembered for his annual assistance with the Sugar Shacks organized for francophone and French immersion schools in the region.
