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# **Sturgeon Hockey Club** expands programs despite arena challenges

Despite some initial ice scheduling challenges, Sturgeon Hockey Club (SHC) is gearing up for exciting changes and growth with their Sting AA program changing leagues and their Fillies female program continuing to grow.

"This season, our four Sting AA teams will be part of the Alberta Elite Hockey League (AEHL) run by Hockey Alberta, which will streamline all levels of elite hockey (AA and AAA) in the province," said SHC Communications Director Vikki McLaren in an email interview with MorinvilleNews.com.

"Our Fillies program has seen exponential growth in its first three years of existence. Two seasons ago, we had

U15 level.

"Last year, we had four teams at the U11, U13, U15 and U18 levels. Now for this season, we are very excited to add an additional U11 team to the mix and our first-ever U9 Fillies team to Sturgeon Hockey Club."

McLaren said SHC's Mustang players could also look forward to another exciting year of competitive hockey within the Edmonton Federation Hockey League.

However, with the loss of the Legal Arena due to a significant renovation and expansion project, practices and games will occur at several arenas in the region.

"We have been fortunate enough to work with the communities of Rich Valley,

one Fillies team at the Onoway, Redwater and the Edmonton Garrison in securing ice at their facilities, which allowed us to register every family looking to play for SHC this season and not have to turn any child away," McLaren said.

"We can't thank these communities enough for their support."

Before the SHC season gets fully underway, the Association is hosting one of the Edmonton Oil Kings pre-season games at the Morinville Leisure Centre on Saturday, September 14 at 4 p.m.

Tickets for the fundraiser sold out within hours on Thursday when they were released.

A 50/50 will be available to the public with details announced on SHC's Facebook page.

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# Morinville family heading to Budapest for World Darts Masters

Morinville resident Robbie Mills, his daughter Hailey, and his son RJ will represent Canada at the World Darts Federation (WDF) World Masters in Budapest, Hungary, from October 9 to 13, 2024.

The Mills believe this is the first time a father, son, and daughter trio will compete at the event, highlighting their talents and bond as a darts family.

The senior Mills is no stranger to professional-level darts, having earned the Alberta Men's No. 1 spot for the last two years and the 2024 Alberta Provincial Championship.

Mills is Canada's second-ranked player this year, a move up from being named Canada's

third-ranked player in 2023. His accomplishments earned him a spot at the 2023 WDF World Cup in Esbjerg, Denmark, where he took the bronze medal.

That placement earned him his invitation to the October Worlds Darts Masters invitation-only event.

Those accomplishments are impressive enough, but then his son and daughter qualified.

"Hailey and RJ qualified through the youth national system," Robbie Mills explained.

"They both made Team Alberta: RJ last year, Hailey this year. Based on their placement and the criteria that the WDF requires, they qualified and received their invites to Budapest as well."

#### A long love of darts

Robbie Mills has been involved in darts for the past 28 years, first taking up the sport in 1996.

"I was 16 years old in high school, sitting at the cafeteria table over lunch. Friends of mine were talking about going to darts on a Thursday night at their youth club, and I was like, 'Darts! What is that?' Mills recalled.

"I decided to show up and borrowed a set of darts. I've kind of been playing ever since."

Daughter Hailey and son RJ took up darts in the past couple of years when they were 10 and 15, respectively. Now 12 and 17, darts have become an important part of their lives.

For Hailey, the appeal of darts is in the environment.

"Lots of people are there to support you, and they're very encouraging," Hailey Mills said. "So, it's a good environment to be around."

For RJ, it was an

opportunity to share the joy of competition and victory.

"I'd always watch dad play or watch some kind of professional play on TV, and I always thought it was cool," RJ Mills recalled.

"I never had an interest in it until October, about a year-and-a-half ago, when I broke my leg. I couldn't do much. We'd be travelling all around Alberta and Canada for all these tournaments for dad. He kept winning and winning and winning, and I got a spark from watching him win. I was like, 'You know, I want to feel that feeling.' So that feeling just really got me into

Pursuant to Section 1(1)(i) of the Municipal Government Act an "elector" means:

A person who is eligible to vote in the election for a councillor under the Local Authorities Election Act.

Pursuant to section 47(1) of the Local Authorities Election Act a person is eligible to vote in an election if the person:

a) is at least 18 years old.

b) is a Canadian citizen, and

c) resides in Alberta and the person's place of residence is located in the local jurisdiction on election day.

In accordance with the provisions of Sections 223 and 225 of the Municipal Government Act, a petition may be demanded in the Town of Bon Accord by electors equal in number to at least 10 per cent of the population. The petition for a vote must be received by the Chief Administrative Officer within 60 days of the last publication of this notice and shall contain on each page "an identical statement of the purpose of the petition".

#### **APPLICATION SUMMARY**

The Alberta Utilities Commission expects to receive an application from ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. to approve the existing current and valid natural gas distribution franchise agreement with the Town of Bon Accord. This application for approval is required due to changes made by the **Utilities Affordability Statutes Amendment** Act, 2024, to various statutes governing franchise agreements.

The current franchise agreement, which took effect in February of 2016, grants ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. the exclusive right to deliver natural gas to the residents of Bon Accord for approximately 15 years.

No changes to the franchise agreement or to the franchise fee rate rider percentage are being made as part of this application. The franchise fee rate rider percentage will remain at its current rate, which is 23%. Including linear taxes, the resulting average monthly franchise fee for an average residential customer will remain the same at approximately \$13.86. The franchise fee is calculated based on distribution charges. An average residential customer uses about 105 gigajoules per year.



keep playing. From his beginnings at 16, Mills played competitively, initially at the youth level, as his children do now.

In his second year, Mills made the Nova Scotia team and continued to compete at that level until age 23, when he made the adult team several times. Mills entered the military at 25 and was kept busy until 2016-2017.

"It's just kind of life took over and got in the way," he said. "We got posted out here in 2018, and I picked them [the darts] up and shook off the rust, and here we are today."

Mills and his family are familiar faces on the Alberta darts circuit, whether it is Robbie's playing Friday Night Jitney at the Crown and Anchor Pub in Castle Downs, The Opus Jitney, or at Jasper Place Legion. The family also travels to the various Darts Alberta ranking tournaments and the occasional event in Saskatchewan or B.C.

"We're a travelling dart family," Robbie Mills said. "The darts atmosphere is amazing, welcoming to the kids. Darts Alberta has a great foundation in place where youth are allowed to

Son RJ is also ready for the opportunity. "I'm looking forward to taking it all in, seeing what it's like to just throw these little darts halfway across the world," he said. "It's definitely going to be a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity because it's hard to achieve these things. They're not given to

you. You have got to earn it, so we must take it [the experience] all in."

For Robbie Mills, there is an anticipation of having the feeling of his World Cup experience. "For myself, it'll be the feeling of Denmark all over again, that competition level," he said.

"This will be a different experience in that I've never been to Budapest. I've competed at the WDF World Cup before. Masters is a little different, so I'm looking forward to that change and challenge."

As the Mills family prepares for Budapest, they focus on the challenge ahead. Representing Canada on the world stage is a significant achievement, and they're ready to compete at their best, knowing the hard work it took to get there.
