Community generosity lights up Santa Store Auction, raising funds for local families

The spirit of the Christmas season shone brightly on Saturday, November 16, as the Midstream Support Society hosted its 27th annual Santa Store Auction. The event raises funds to ensure children have gifts to open on Christmas morning and families receive assistance with utility bills during difficult times.

long-standing event, held for the first time at the Morinville Community Cultural Centre (MCCC), featured a buffet dinner, a dessert station, and a lively auction led by longtime auctioneer Brad Ward. As in previous years, his

humour and enthusiasm helped drive up bids on more than 110 lots of items.

"We raised a large amount of money, \$24,215. We received a \$3500 donation from the Lions Club that unexpected," said Lisa Piche, one of the event's organizers. "We were very grateful to everyone

for all the donations and to those who attended our event."

Despite another successful tally raised to help those in need, Piche said this year was challenging for volunteers as several longtime regulars were unavailable.

up for the auction and the clean-up, she said. It ended up being a great evening. We learned a few things that we can use to make next year even better."


With rising costs of living and increasing financial strain on families, the support raised during the event will provide crucial relief during the holiday season.

Morinville Council briefs

Here is an overview of some of the items on the Tuesday, Nov. 12 Council agenda.

Rates and Charges

Town council has approved the Rates and Charges Bylaw for 2025.

Second and third readings of the annually renewed bylaw were passed at council's regular meeting Tuesday.

The bylaw includes utility rates for the upcoming year.

Wastewater charges will increase by 5.8%,

\$0.20, while there will be no change in the water rate.

Stormwater fees will go up \$2.50/ month for residences and \$5.00 per month non-residential sites.

GFL contract increases, and recycling charges will result in a \$1.11 a month increase for solid waste.

A new weekend tournament rental rate for the baseball diamonds has been included in the bylaw. Groups can now rent diamonds from 6 p.m. Friday to 6 p.m. Sunday at a reduced cost.

Notices of motion

Councillor Maurice St. Denis presented a notice of motion during the Tuesday session.

Αt an upcoming meeting he will move that council direct administration to provide an information report regarding the pedestrian and traffic concerns brought forward by residents in the Meadows of Morinville correspondence.

Councillor Stephen Dafoe had several motions for debate, which he had previously given notice of.

However, he left the meeting around 6 p.m. due to a medical emergency. He was taken to the hospital, and as a result, he was unable to present or discuss the motions, which were deferred to a future meeting.

The motions, which were referred to a future meeting of council include:

"That council direct administration to return to a future meeting- a report outlining: options available to council and examples from other municipalities regarding limiting the number of any one type of business in the community; and options available to council and examples from other municipalities regarding setting distance requirements between businesses of the same type."

Another motion was that council diadministration to explore Morinville offering the Clean Energy Improvement Program to residential and commercial property owners, including examples of other municipalities'

bylaws required by the program.

The other motion was that council direct administration to develop and include a section on logical fallacies in the orientation binder for newly elected municipal officials to enhance critical thinking, decision-makingandpublic communication.

Military Events

Councillor Rebecca Balanko reported on the work of the Edmonton Salutes committee, on which she is the Morinville representative.

The committee works with other like-minded organizations to improve and enrich the lives of military members, veterans, and their families in the Capital Region.

Balanko stated that recently the committee has worked key messaging objectives for the coming year and dealt with funding requests, Remembrance Day information and updates from the military.

"I, the Mayor, and

Councillor St. Denis attended both the 1st Poppy Presentation and on November 1st, a very moving and informative CFB Warrant Officers' and Sergeants' Vet Appreciation Night," she also noted. "We had the opportunity to meet many who have served, including a 102-year-old WW2 veteran."

Closed Session


Council passed a special resolution at the meeting to allow for a closed session including only its members and Legislative Services and Human Resources staff.

Up for discussion were a personnel matter and the organizational contract update.

Freedom of Information and Privacy Act section 17 (Disclosure Harmful to Personal Privacy and section 24 (Advice from Officials) were cited in justification of the closed session.

There was no business arising to be discussed in open council session.

PUBLIC HEARING – Bylaw 1660/24 Amendment to Land Use Bylaw 1385/17

Sturgeon County Council requests public input on proposed Bylaw 1660/24.

This Bylaw would redistrict a portion of SW-1-55-25-4 from AG – Agriculture District to I3 - Medium Industrial Unserviced District.

The proponent is seeking to relocate and expand their existing business (access mat manufacturing). As this land is currently designated as 'Agriculture District' which does not allow this type of activity, redistricting is being proposed to accommodate or allow for the associated uses.

Each time land is redistricted, a bylaw is needed to amend the Land Use Bylaw, and a Public Hearing must be held.



are depleted," said Morinville Food Bank President Brenda Malychuk, adding that the demands of the season lead to increased requests for support as families try to stretch the dollars."

Malychuk highlighted key items needed to meet the community's needs, including canned fruits, vegetables, soups, stews, chili,

jam, peanut butter, and easy-to-prepare sides like Sidekicks and Knorr pasta and rice packages.

"Of course, this time of year, any special extras that can be added to hampers to give families a little extra treat is always welcome," Malychuk said.

"As we have an ongoing need, we accept any non-expired non-perishable items."

For those unable to drop off donations at the event, there are additional ways to contribute.

Non-perishable food items can be left at donation boxes located in No Frills and Sobeys year-round.




