Building skills on and off the ice: The Gibbons Grizzly Hockey Program

The Gibbons Grizzly Hockey Program isn't just about developing hockey players – it's about shaping well-rounded individuals.

By focusing on both hockey and life skills, this program at Gibbons School provides students with the tools they need to succeed on the ice, in the classroom, and beyond.

One of the standout aspects of the program is its emphasis on teaching students critical life skills, such as time management and organization.

According to Jason Knight, these lessons are naturally built into the daily routine.

"The students need to develop the skill of time management by individually being responsible to get their

equipment from our storage area after their block 4 class at 10:30 AM and meet at the school door, gear in hand, ready to walk to the rink," he explains.

From getting dressed and being on the ice by 11:00 AM to quickly returning to school, eating lunch, and preparing for their afternoon classes, students learn the

importance of planning ahead.

"They need to plan the night before and ensure that their hockey bag is ready to go for their scheduled ice session," Knight adds.

Mistakes happen, of course. "The odd student forgets their skates, a glove, or their neck guard, but I guarantee that they

rarely do it again – missing an ice session is painful for most hockey-crazy kids," he laughs.

Accountability extends to the classroom as well. "To be honest, I didn't dream as a young hockey player to be a teacher," Knight shares.

"However, hockey was the vessel that brought me to college hockey and eventually became a teacher. So, classroom performance is followed to ensure that our student athletes make their education a priority."

As the program

grows, Jason Knight is optimistic about its future.
"We truly hope that

"We truly hope that the program increases in numbers. Both our elementary and junior high groups have room for more eager student athletes," he says.

This year, the program also took steps to become more accessible by lowering tuition fees.

"Our hope is to make the option at Gibbons School more accessible for our students," he explains.

With its focus on hockey skill development, life skills, and accessibility, the Gibbons Grizzly Hockey Program is more than just a sports initiative – it's a community where young athletes can thrive.

Whether students are dreaming of future hockey success or just want to enjoy the game, this program ensures they are building skills that will last a lifetime.

LAND USE BYLAW

Focused Review and Update

The Town of Gibbon's is undertaking a **focused review and update** to the Town's current Land Use Bylaw.

Alberta's Municipal Government Act requires municipalities to have a Land Use Bylaw. This is not a new requirement; all municipalities have had a Land Use Bylaw for several decades. A Land Use Bylaw establishes rules and regulations for land use and development as well as processes for making decisions on subdivision and development permit applications.

The Land Use Bylaw includes a wide range of regulations, including:

- Development permit application requirements;
- The maximum height, number, and size of buildings on a lot; and
- Lists of permitted and discretionary uses for each land use district.

The Town of Gibbons' current Land Use Bylaw is almost 20 years old. Since it was adopted, new development pressures and trends have emerged, and provincial legislation related to planning and development have been amended several times by the Government of Alberta. The current Land Use Bylaw has been amended approximately 55 times to address mapping and regulatory changes.

Through 2024, Town Administration and Council have developed and reviewed a draft Land Use Bylaw that is now ready for community input.

The primary purpose of this review and update is to address changes to provincial legislation and to reduce red tape associated with subdivision and development processes (where appropriate). The Town wishes to enable a wider range of commercial, industrial, and residential development opportunities that address the needs of existing and future Town residents.

A copy of the draft Land Use Bylaw (and a summary of the proposed changes) will be available on the Town of Gibbon's website at the end of January: www.gibbons.ca.



PUBLIC OPEN HOUSES

Online and In-Person Opportunities

The next step in this project is to **invite community members** to attend the project's open houses. Two open houses will be held to provide community members with the opportunity to learn about the project and provide feedback.

Online: Wednesday, February 5, 2025 (6:00 PM to 8:00 PM)

A link to join the meeting will be available on the Town's website the day of the online open house.

At the online open house, community members will have the opportunity to learn more about the draft Land Use Bylaw **during the presentation**. There will be opportunities to ask questions, hear answers, and provide feedback on the draft Land Use Bylaw that will be shared with Town Council for their consideration.

In-Person: Saturday, February 8, 2025 (10:00 AM to 1:00 PM)

Gibbons Cultural Centre

At the in-person open house, community members will have the opportunity to learn more about the draft Land Use Bylaw by chatting one-on-one with the project team and viewing information posters and maps. Drop-in anytime during the open house (no scheduled presentation); there will be opportunities to ask questions, hear answers, and provide feedback on the draft Land Use Bylaw that will be shared with Town Council for their consideration.
