

Morinville RCMP investigate church fire from early morning hours of June 30th, 2021 - Update

Morinville RCMP continue their investigation into the June 30, 2022, arson of the St. Jean Baptiste Church in Morinville.

During this investigation information has come forward regarding suspects acting suspicious in the area leading up to the fire. These suspects are described as:

- 3 Males;
- Medium complexion;
- 2 of the males had long black hair, 3rd male wearing a ball cap;
- All 3 were last seen leaving the area in a early 90's GMC or Chevrolet pick up with a loud muffler.

RCMP are releasing this information in hopes that it will generate more tips from the public.

"This fire destroyed a prominent landmark in the town of Morinville and we remain

steadfast in solving this crime," says Staff Sergeant Darcy McGunigal Detachment Commander Morinville RCMP, "Know that any tips received will be promptly investigated."

Primary Care Alberta Virtual MD service hits milestone: 100,000 calls referred

A Primary Care Alberta (PCA) service that refers Health Link 811 callers to a physician who can assess them over the phone or through a secure Zoom link has surpassed the 100,000-caller milestone.

Launched in 2022, Virtual MD reduces potentially unnecessary emergency department visits.

When Albertans contact Health Link 811, a registered nurse or clinical staff member provides an assessment to determine whether they're in need of further assessment from a physician.

On average, 125 Health Link callers are referred to a physician daily through the Virtual MD program.

"Virtual MD has proven to be an innovative solution to provide Albertans

with the care they need, often at home or in their community, easing pressures on our emergency departments," says Adriana LaGrange, Minister of Health.

Of the first 100,000 patients assessed by a program physician, about half were able to manage their condition at home with self-care.

Other patients were referred to other forms of in-person care or follow-up that best suited their needs, such as urgent care centres, family medicine practitioners, other community-based programs and emergency departments.

"Virtual MD is there for patients when they need it at critical points in their healthcare journey," says Patricia Chambers, Executive Lead of Patient Navigation and

System Integration with PCA.

"To reach this milestone shows us how critical this program is in innovatively meeting the healthcare needs of Albertans, no matter where they are."

The service - available seven days a week from 6 a.m. to 2 a.m. - involves 90 physicians.

"The virtual option to meet with patients enables us to connect with pockets of Albertans who may struggle to access these services: those with mobility or transportation issues, individuals in rural areas or those who have limited access to care," says Dr. Genelle Dingeldein, a Virtual MD physician.

"We can provide immediate advice in real-time and help patients navigate

PUBLIC HEARING – Bylaw 1670/24 Amendment to Land Use Bylaw 1385/17

Sturgeon County Council requests public input on proposed Bylaw 1670/24. This Bylaw would redistrict a portion of SW-29-55-26-W4 from R4 – Hamlet Serviced District to DC24 – Direct Control District 24.

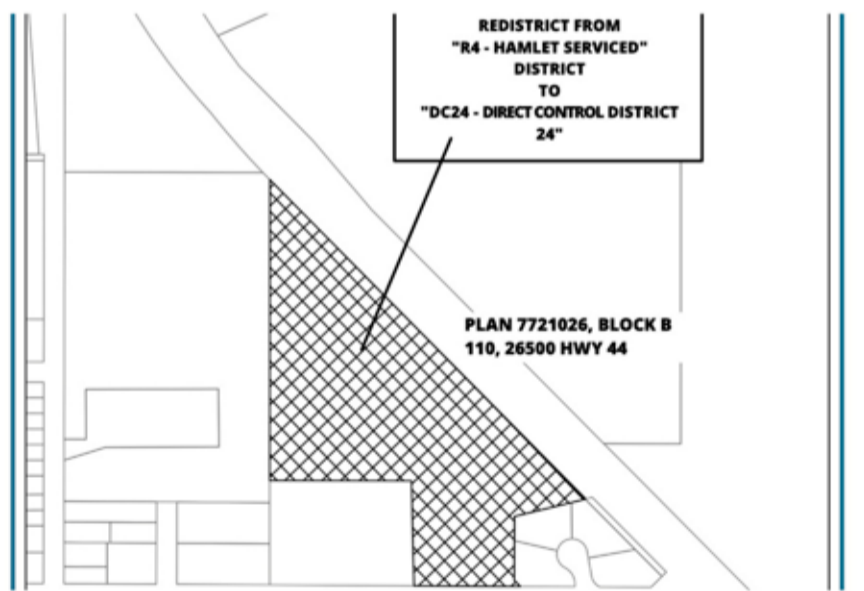
The proponent is seeking to relocate their existing business (Recreational Vehicle Sales) to the hamlet of Riviere Qui Barre. As this land is currently designated as 'Hamlet Residential' which does not allow this type of activity, redistricting is being proposed to accommodate or allow for the associated uses.

Each time land is redistricted, a bylaw is needed to amend the Land Use Bylaw, and a Public Hearing must be held.

Two fatalities in Highway 2 collision near Township Road 580

On February 6, at 11:34 a.m., Morinville RCMP received a report of a two-vehicle collision on Highway 2 near Township Road 580. Upon arrival, emergency crews attended to multiple victims.

The driver and lone occupant of one vehicle, a 73-year-old female Sturgeon County resident, had succumbed to her

injuries.

The passenger of the other vehicle, an 83-year-old female Rochester resident, was also deceased. The driver of that vehicle was transported to the hospital with non-life-threatening injuries.

RCMP remained at the scene for several hours conducting an investigation. Police have since cleared the

area. Initial reports indicated that one of the vehicles, a pick-up truck, lost control and veered into on-coming traffic, where it collided with another pickup truck.

Road conditions were believed to have been a contributing factor in the collision.

RCMP extends its condolences to the family and friends of the deceased.

What is the Proposed Area Structure Plan Amendment About?

The proposed Bylaw (3/2025) amends the Coeur de Morinville Area Structure Plan (ASP) to remove the use of direct control districts and redistricting policies in the ASP which will reduce complex barriers to residential redevelopment and infill in the Coeur of Morinville.

The areas in the ASP that were originally directed to be redistricted to a direct control district will now have the flexibility to apply for one of Morinville's existing standard land use districts.

Council approval will still be required for any changes to Land Use Districts through a Land Use Bylaw amendment and a public hearing will still be required for any such changes.
