

King Charles III Coronation Medal Presentation Ceremony held in Stony Plain

On Saturday, March 8, over 100 people gathered at the Mainstreet Ballroom in the Best Western Sunrise Inn & Suites in Stony Plain for the presentation ceremony of the King

Charles III Coronation Medal.

Guests were treated to a souvenir program, Canada pins, music by Shannon Alex, and a large cake decorated with the image of the medal and Royal Cypher, along with beverages.

Emcee Julia Roy's opening remarks were followed by a speech from Dane Lloyd, MP for Sturgeon River-Parkland.

In his presentation, Lloyd stated, "His Majesty's Coronation Medal recognizes unique

and significant contributions made to our country, province, and community, or deeds that have brought significant credit to Canada abroad. Gathered here today are members of our community who have

served our country in the Canadian Armed Forces, made life-saving scientific breakthroughs, dedicated their professional lives to helping others as first responders, advocated for young people, and tirelessly supported

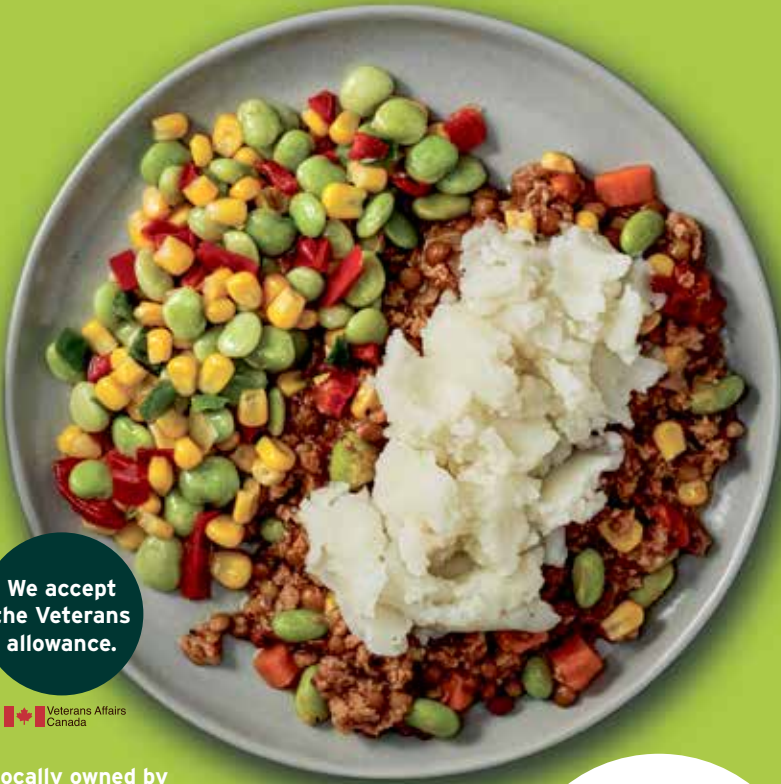
philanthropic causes to improve the lives of people around us."

Lloyd continued, noting that the medal marks an important milestone in history, as it is the first coronation medal

Morinville Jets sweep Mustangs in semi-final with thrilling 3-2 OT wiin

The Morinville Jets have punched their ticket to the Capital Junior Hockey League (CJHL) final after sweeping the Edmonton Mustangs in three straight games, capping off the series with a nail-biting 3-2 overtime victory on Sunday, March 9.

The Jets had already secured 6-3 and 5-4 wins earlier in the week before returning home to clinch the series in front of an electrified standing-room-only crowd.

The decisive Game 3 was a battle from start to finish, with both teams refusing to give an inch.

Morinville opened the scoring late in the first period when Kwentyn Oss netted his second of the playoffs, assisted by Isaac Kinsella and Caleb Young.

However, the

Mustangs responded just five minutes later with a power-play goal from Chad Cote, tying the game 1-1 after 20 minutes.

The second period saw no scoring, but the Mustangs took their first lead of the night midway through the third when Owen Goertzen found the back of the net.

With time winding down, it looked like the Mustangs might force a Game 4.

But the Jets refused to go quietly. Just 12 seconds later, Jacob Klassen capitalized


on a setup from Ethan Dechamplain and Cody Laliberte, tying the game at 2-2 and sending it to overtime.

The extra frame saw both teams push hard, but it was Graeme Hampton who sealed the deal for the Jets with 5:32 left on the clock, with assists from Josh Konanz and William Kinsella.

With the win, the Jets advance to the CJHL championship series.

Their opponent was not determined at press time.

designed and struck in Canada.

Prior to Her Majesty's Silver Jubilee in 1977, coronation and Jubilee medals were designed and allotted for the whole Commonwealth by the United Kingdom.

He also expressed gratitude to all those who submitted nominations for deserving community members.

"It is truly inspiring to see the impact that individuals like yourselves can have in our area on a wide range of issues and causes. We are fortunate to live in a community

surrounded by so many selfless leaders," Lloyd said.

Among the more than 20 recipients were several from Morinville-Sturgeon County, including Susan Evans, former two-term Councillor for Sturgeon County, for her services to Politics, Public Service, and Justice; Rev. Gregory Fraser for his services to Community and Philanthropy; Mary Kieftenbeld for her contributions to Arts and Media (she wrote "Alberta Song" for the Province's 100th anniversary); MCpl retired Pete Marwick for services to Community and Philanthropy;

Sturgeon Rural Crime Watch Association marks first year under new leadership

On March 11, 2025, the Sturgeon Rural Crime Watch Association (SRCWA) held its Annual General Meeting (AGM) at the Gibbons Cultural Center, where President Kelvin Kozak provided an update on the Association's progress in his first year as President. Kelvin, who accepted the nomination for the role in April 2024, shared the initiatives and challenges that have shaped the SRCWA's efforts to combat crime in the area.

As a long-time resident and multi-generational farmer, Kelvin has witnessed the increase in crime over the years and felt a strong desire to take action. He has always told his children, "Complaining does not solve problems, but getting involved does." With this in mind, he stepped

forward to lead the SRCWA.

Increased visibility and community engagement

Under Kelvin's leadership, the Association focused on becoming more visible throughout the County. Board Members took the SRCWA float to local parades, its trailer to Wellness on Wheels (WOW) events, and set up booths at various

trade shows. These efforts helped the Association engage with the community, raise awareness, and promote crime prevention. Additionally, the SRCWA has worked to enhance its online presence, with a new website under development under the Provincial Rural Crime Watch Association, and a more active Facebook page. There has also been an increase in Crime

Watch signage across the County, helping to make the organization's presence felt by more residents.

Collaboration with local authorities

The SRCWA also worked closely with local officials, including County Councillors, Protective Services, and RCMP detachments. These partnerships allowed the Association to share valuable

insights and advice at Board Meetings, while working together to develop and promote various crime prevention programs. Some of the key initiatives supported by the SRCWA this year included "Positive Ticketing," OHV training, Crime Prevention information sessions, and "Coffee with a Cop" events, which allowed residents to meet informally with local law enforcement.

Focus on youth involvement

One of the challenges the SRCWA faces is recruitment, especially when it comes

to engaging younger residents. Recognizing the importance of building future leadership, Kelvin highlighted the Association's efforts to increase youth participation. Constable Wills, the School Resource Officer, has identified several youths interested in volunteering with the SRCWA, and Kelvin is excited to involve them in upcoming projects with the Directors.

This initiative aims to not only build a stronger foundation for the future of the Association but also to give young people the tools to take an active role in keeping their communities safe.

Expansion and restructuring

In May 2022, the SRCWA expanded its boundaries to cover the entire County of

PUBLIC HEARING – Bylaw 1662/24 Amendment to Land Use Bylaw 1385/17

Sturgeon County Council requests public input on proposed Bylaw 1662/24, Site Grading Amendments 2025.

Sturgeon County is proposing the following amendments to the Land Use Bylaw:

- Enhance regulations for commercial and industrial site grading and make commercial and industrial site grading a permitted use.
- Clarify regulations regarding drainage, wetlands, road use and stockpiling of materials.
- Regulate import and types of fill material for site grading.
- Add flexibility to residential lot grading if a development won't affect drainage.

A bylaw is needed to amend existing bylaws, and a public hearing must be held.

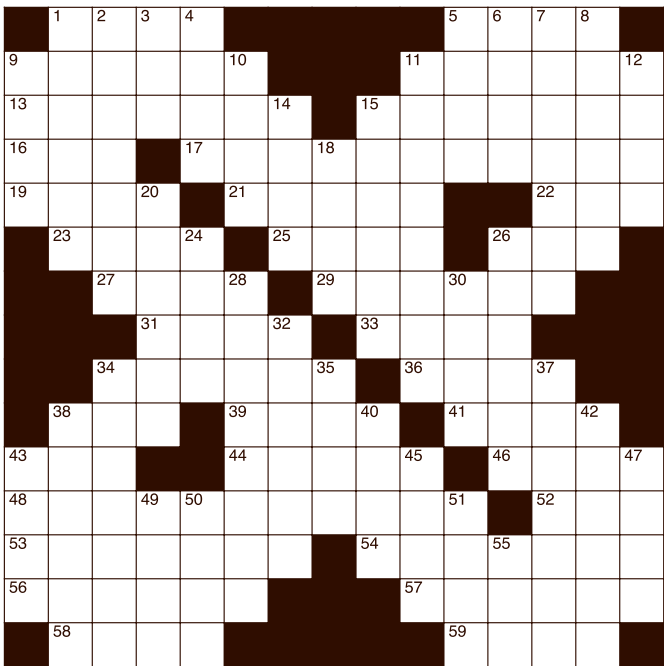

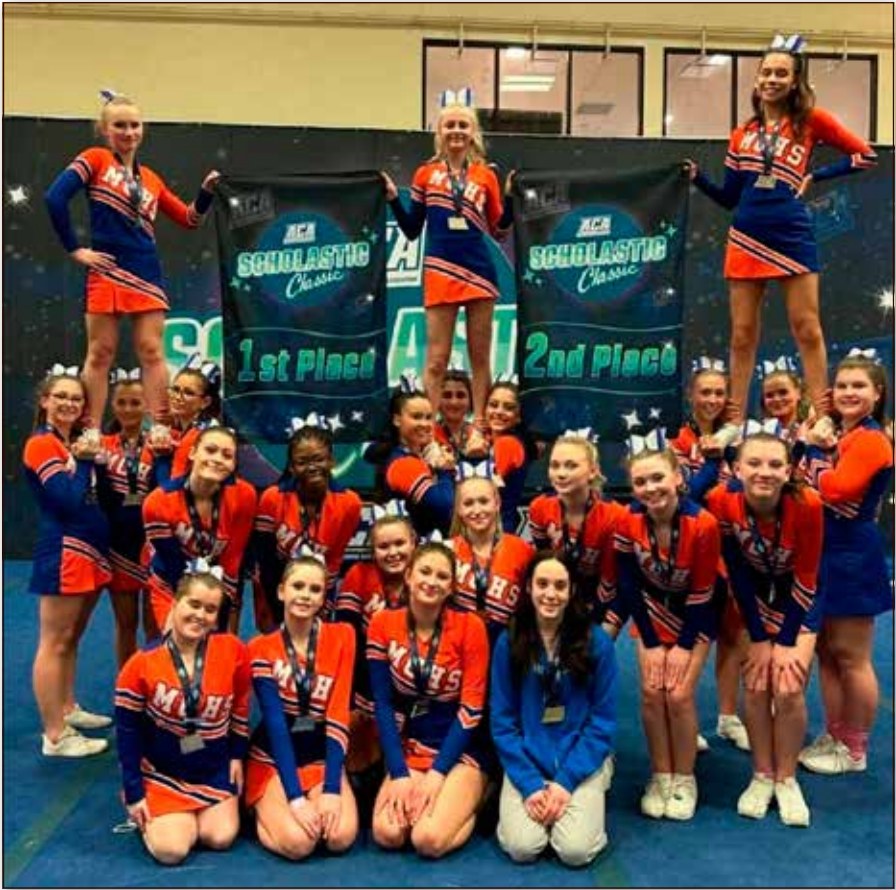

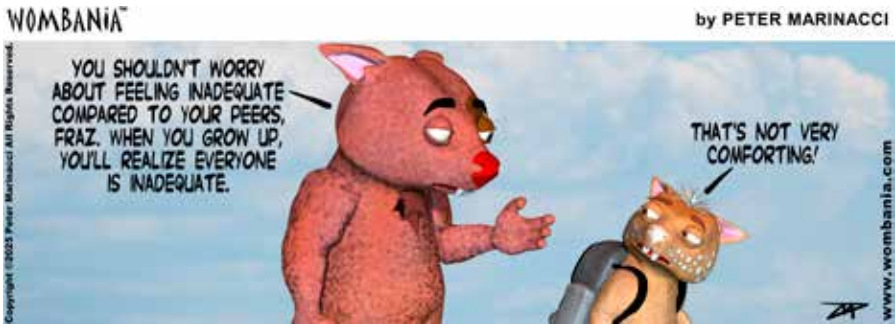

Borrowing Bylaw 1677/25
Broadband Infrastructure (Phase 2)

Section 251 – The Municipal Government Act

Take notice that the Council of Sturgeon County, in the Province of Alberta, has given first reading to **Borrowing Bylaw 1677/25** which will, upon final passage and approval, authorize the proper officers of the said County to borrow monies from Province of Alberta, or another authorized Financial Institution, to pay for the cost of the phase 2 construction of broadband infrastructure.

The total cost of the aforesaid project amounts to \$15,736,689. A total of \$6,810,744 is to be borrowed on the credit and security of the municipality at large by a fixed term debenture. The debenture is to be repayable to the Province of Alberta, or another authorized financial institution, in installment payments with an annual interest not to exceed ten per cent (10%), or the interest rate as fixed from time to time by the Province of Alberta or other authorized financial institution.

NOW THEREFORE NOTICE is hereby given by the Council of Sturgeon County that, unless a petition of the electors for a vote on **Bylaw 1677/25** is demanded, as provided for by the terms of Section 231 of the Municipal Government Act, the said Council may pass the said borrowing bylaw.

The proposed bylaw may be examined between the hours of 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. in the office of the Legislative Services Officer, Sturgeon County, 9613-100 Street, Morinville, Alberta.

Sturgeon and reorganized from 16 zones to 6 zones to better reflect the divisions of the County.

This restructuring has helped the Association better serve residents across a broader area, allowing for more efficient communication and response to local crime issues.

engagement, partnerships with local authorities, and increased involvement from youth.
