Morinville Public School to be replaced with modern facility

Morinville is set to receive a brand-new public school as part of the latest round of government funding for school infrastructure.

Sturgeon Public Schools has been granted funding to

replace the current École Morinville Public School, a move that will ensure students in the area have access to a modern, safe, and engaging learning environment designed to meet the needs of the growing community.

The replacement

school, which will cater to students from pre-kindergarten through Grade 4, is expected to feature innovative and flexible learning spaces that foster creativity, collaboration, and engagement.

It will also include improved

accessibility features and upgraded infrastructure to ensure the school can accommodate the needs of all students.

The new design will prioritize both student comfort and educational efficiency, creating an environment that supports

academic success and overall well-being.

The funding received will allow for the design phase of the new facility to begin, marking a significant step forward in turning the vision for this modern educational space into a reality.



This exciting announcement comes at a time when local school divisions are facing capacity challenges.

The city's two largest school divisions have issued warnings that, without

the construction of new buildings, public schools could run out of space by 2027.

In addition, Catholic schools in the region are expected to be over capacity by 2029.

The need for new schools has become increasingly urgent as the population of the area continues to grow, and this new school is a vital part of addressing that growth.

The Morinville replacement school is just one of many projects included in the 2025 provincial budget as part of the larger \$8.6-billion school construction accelerator program. This ambitious initiative was announced by Premier Danielle Smith in September

2024 and aims to build 90 new schools, modernize or replace up to 24 schools, and expand charter school space within the next four to seven years.

The funding for these projects will go a long way toward ensuring that schools across the province can keep up with growing populations and continue to provide high-quality educational experiences to students in well-equipped, state-of-the-art facilities.

In Alberta, the typical timeline for building elementary and junior high schools is about two years, while high schools typically require about three years to complete construction. This means that, once the planning phase for the Morinville replacement school is complete, construction could be

underway relatively quickly, bringing this much-needed educational facility closer to reality.

In addition to the Morinville project, Sturgeon Public Schools has also received planning dollars for the development of a new K-9 school in Gibbons. This funding will support the initial stages of planning and design for the new school, which will also serve the growing community in that area. As both Morinville and Gibbons experience population increases, these investments in education will help ensure that students in both communities will have access to high-quality educational spaces that meet their needs.

These new schools will not only address

the increasing demand for educational facilities but will also provide students with modern spaces that enhance their learning experiences. The new buildings will be designed to support both traditional and innovative learning styles, helping to ensure that students are

well-prepared for the future.

As the planning process continues, further details, including timelines and project specifics, are expected to be released. The announcement of the Morinville replacement school is just the beginning of an

exciting period for the local education system, and these new investments in school infrastructure will help ensure that students in Morinville, Gibbons, and beyond continue to receive the best possible learning experiences in facilities that are built for the future.

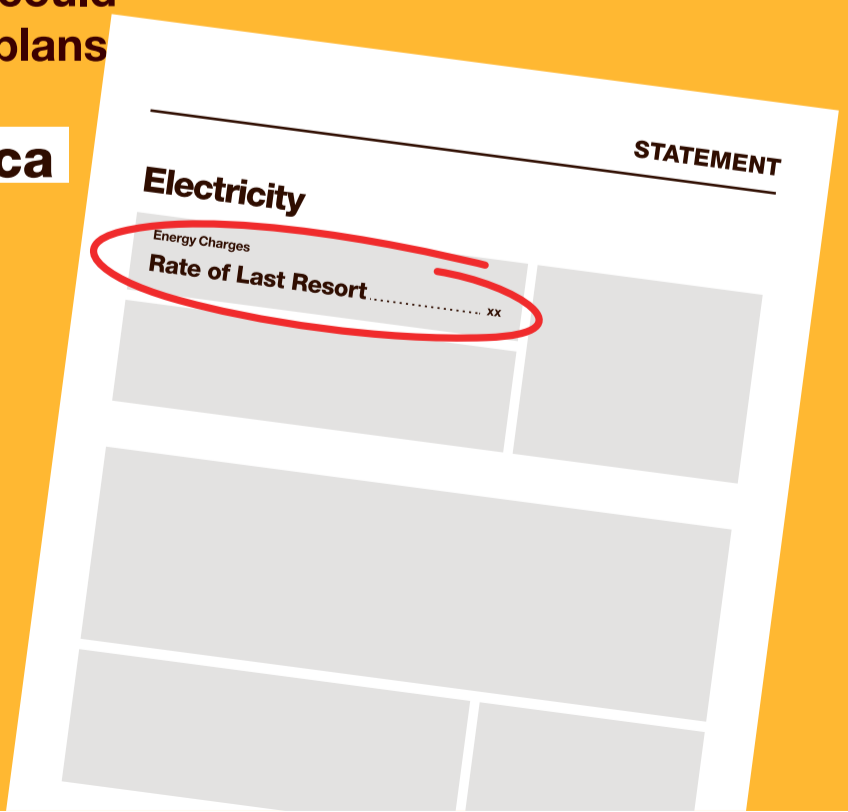

Anyone who attended these locations at these times who was born in or after 1970 and has less than two documented doses of measles-containing vaccine, is at risk for developing measles and is strongly encouraged to review their immunization records and monitor themselves for symptoms of measles.

Measles is an extremely contagious disease and is spread easily through the air.

Symptoms of Measles include:

- Fever of 38.3° C or higher; and
- Cough, runny nose and/or red eyes; and
- A red blotchy rash that appears three to seven days after fever starts, beginning behind the ears and on the face and spreading

down the body and then to the arms and legs.

If symptoms of measles do develop, individuals are advised to stay home and call Health Link at 811 before visiting any healthcare facility or provider, including a family physician clinic or pharmacy.

Measles vaccine is highly effective at preventing infection and complications. People born in or since 1970 who have received fewer than two doses of measles-containing vaccine are susceptible to infection. Those who have received fewer than two doses of measles-containing vaccine AND are pregnant, under one year of age, are adults and/or have a weakened immune system are at most risk of complications from measles, should contact Health Link at 811 promptly if exposed to measles as they may be eligible for vaccine or immune globulin to reduce the risk of developing measles.

In Alberta, measles vaccine is offered, free of charge, through Alberta's publicly funded immunization

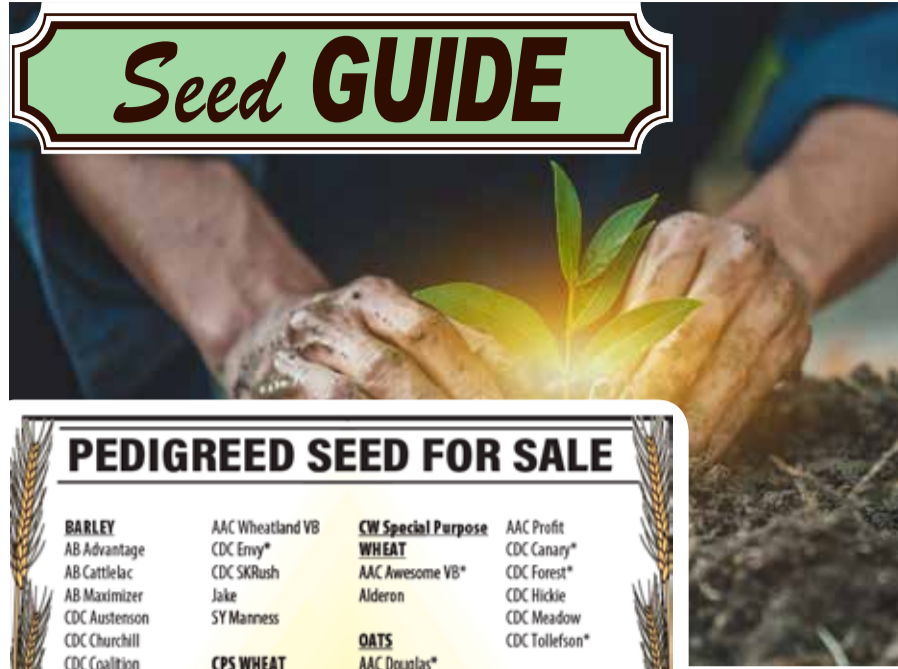

program. Children in Alberta typically receive their first dose of measles vaccine at 12 months of age, and their second dose at 18 months of age.


Albertans uncertain of their immunization history, or their child's immunization history, can text 'vaccine record' to 88111, call Health Link at 811 or your local public health office. Albertans can also text 'Measles' to

88111 to get measles health information texted to your mobile device. However, anyone who is not up to date for their recommended vaccines can receive them by booking an appointment with your local public health office.

Hay Permits Along Provincial Highways (2025) Attention Land Owners

Ledcor Highways Ltd. along with Alberta Transportation advises that anyone interested in cutting hay along the highway right of ways will need to apply for a permit. For Contract Maintenance Area (CMA) 509 and 510 submit application to Ledcor Highways Ltd. Adjacent landowners will have until July 1st to apply. All other applicant permits will be issued within 14 days of receiving the application. There is no fee for the permits.

At the time of application, all persons wanting to cut hay MUST provide proof of \$2,000,000 liability insurance.

Note: Some permits may not be issued due to weed infestation problems.
