Redwater Recreation Area wildfire now under control

After more than two intense weeks of fire-fighting, the wildfire at the Redwater Recreation Area has officially been classified as under control, thanks to the coordinated efforts of Sturgeon County, the Sturgeon Regional Emergency Management Partnership, and Alberta Wildfire crews.

The wildfire, which scorched 3,230 hectares, is no longer spreading. Over 200 emergency personnel worked tirelessly on the ground and in the air to contain the fire. Thanks to commitment and rapid response, there was no loss of life, and property loss was limited to three dwellings: one house, a recreational cabin, and an RV trailer.

Fire crews continue to monitor and extinguish hot spots deep within the fire zone, with helicopter support on standby should flare-ups occur. While the situation has stabilized, authorities stress that the Redwater Recreation Area remains closed under Alberta Parks jurisdiction, and all road closures must still be respected to ensure the safety of personnel and the public.

As of 9:00 a.m. on May 21, Sturgeon County has officially lifted its State of Local Emergency. The off-highway vehicle (OHV) and ATV ban has also been removed, and the full fire ban has been reduced to a fire restriction.

CUPW begins legal strike action with nationwide overtime ban—Canada Post continues operations, but delivery delays expected

The Canadian Union of Postal Workers (CUPW) officially launched a nationwide overtime ban today, marking the start of legal strike action by employees in both its Urban and Rural and Suburban Mail Carrier (RSMC) bargaining units.

Starting at midnight local time on May 23, CUPW members have refused to work any overtime hours. While unionized postal workers will continue their regular duties, the refusal to work overtime is expected to reduce operational flexibility at Canada Post, potentially causing delays in mail and parcel deliveries. Despite this disruption, Canada Post confirms it remains fully operational for now, with no full work stoppages or rotating strikes reported.

The union describes overtime as a necessary and measured step after months of stalled negotiations. CUPW representatives workers face increasing workloads, especially in parcel delivery, without adequate compensation or improved working conditions. Rising parcel volumes in recent years have added pressure to postal workers, who argue they are being asked to do more

while their wages and support have not kept pace.

By imposing an overtime ban, CUPW aims to pressure Canada Post to address these issues while still maintaining essential postal services. The strike action is fully legal under the current labor laws and is intended to escalate negotiations without completely halting mail delivery.

On May 21, Canada Post presented CUPW with "global offers" designed to address union concerns while balancing the corporation's financial realities. These offers include proposed wage increases, the removal of some contentious contract items, and adjustments aimed at helping Canada Post remain competitive, particularly in the inimportcreasingly ant parcel delivery business.

Canada Post has made the full details of these offers publicly available at canadapost.ca/offers and has expressed willingness to resume negotiations with the help of mediators at any time.

The overtime ban has already coincided with a noticeable drop in parcel and mail volumes as businesses and individuals prepare for possible disruptions. Both CUPW and Canada

Post acknowledge that the situation remains fluid. There are currently no plans for rotating strikes or full work stoppages, but if talks continue to stall, further escalation in strike activities could occur.

Canada Post warns that a full labor disruption would have serious consequences not only for the company's financial stability but also for millions of Canadians and businesses that rely on timely postal services. The union, meanwhile, insists stronger action may be needed to achieve fair treatment and sustainable working conditions.

Postal services are vital to everyday life across Canada—from delivering bills and government communications to supporting e-commerce and small businesses with parcel shipments. A prolonged labor dispute risks significant delays, increased costs, and disruptions to Canadians' daily routines.

Both CUPW and Canada Post say they remain committed to resolving their differences through negotiation, but significant gaps persist. The coming days and weeks will be critical as the two sides work to find common ground before the dispute escalates further.

Paige Smith leaves her mark with Edmonton Jr. Oilers White

Gibbons native Paige Smith wrapped up a remarkable season with the Edmonton Jr. Oilers White, making a strong impact throughout the year. Previously a standout on rival teams—St. Albert Bauer Slash (2022-2023) and St. Albert Raiders Slash (2023-2024)—Smith made a significant transition this season, joining the very team she once competed against and quickly becoming an essential part of the roster.

Smith's arrival was immediately felt. The Jr. Oilers White kicked off the season by capturing gold at the Calgary Fire Starter Tournament. From there, the team surged through their league with unmatched confinishing sistency, the season with only one loss—and that, in overtime.

Her coach, Joel Lenius, praised Smith's immediate impact on and off the ice.

"Paige was always playing against us on a competing team," Joel recalled. "This season she ended up choosing to come to our team. We won the Calgary Fire Starter Tournament, and from a season perspective, we only lost one game all year. She became a pretty good leader for us and was well respected by her teammates and evervone in the room. Even though she was a pretty good rival of ours, I think she fit in

pretty nicely."

The team went on to dominate the playoffs and claimed the league championship, before earning the Pacific Regional title in Vancouver. Their journey culminated with a national title at the prestigious Esso Cup in Lloydminster—Canada's national women's U18 hockey championship.

And in that final tournament, Paige Smith didn't just contribute—she shone. Smith was named MVP of the Esso Cup, an elite honor selected by Hockey Canada, recognizing her as one of the country's most complete and influential players at the event.

"The team gelled really well," Coach Joel said. "They had a lot of respect for each other and for Paige. At the Esso Cup, she was the MVP. She's just a complete player—a 200-foot player. She plays both sides of the puck. She's a great addition to our program, and I'm certainly going to miss her next year because she's moving on to play NCAA hockey in Minnesota."

As for her future, the sky is the limit. Coach Joel believes the foundation of Smith's game—her tenacity and work ethic—will carry her far.

"I think for her, it's to continue to be the hardest working player. She continuously outworks her skill—and she's a skillful player. Any team is lucky to have her.

She's just such a complete hockey player. I know she's going to walk into her team next year and be a leader for her group."

Now set to embark on a four-year journey at Bemidji State University in northern Minnesota to pursue a degree in Exercise Science (Kinesiology), 18-year-old Paige Smith leaves behind a legacy of resilience, growth, and excellence. After 14 years on the ice, beginning at just four years old, Smith's season with the Edmonton Jr. Oilers White was nothing short of extraordinary. fierce rival to trusted leader, her evolution captured the spirit of junior hockey at its best. "The best part of the season wasn't iust about winning nationals—it the whole year," said Smith. "The culture we had and built was incredible. The relentless work we put in to get to where we got to wouldn't have been obtainwithout support we had from our coaches. It was a season of triumph, but more than that, a season of heart. It was a rare occasion to be able to play with such a great team and great coaching staff." As she takes her next steps academically and athletically, Smith leaves a mark not only on her hometown of Gibbons, but also on the broader Canadian hockey community.





PUBLIC HEARING – Bylaw 1675/25 Amendment to Land Use Bylaw 1385/17

Sturgeon County Council requests public input on proposed Bylaw 1675/25. This Bylaw would redistrict SE-12-57-21-4 from AG – Agriculture to RE – Resource Extraction.

The proponent (SIL Industrial Minerals) is seeking to develop a natural resource extraction operation, specifically silica sand extraction. As this land is currently designated as 'Agriculture' which does not allow this type of activity, redistricting is being proposed to accommodate or allow for the associated uses.

Each time land is redistricted, a bylaw is needed to amend the Land Use Bylaw, and a Public Hearing must be held.




