Alberta RCMP Major Crimes Unit investigate homicide in Morinville

On April 18, 2025 at approximately 4:30 a.m., Morinville RCMP responded to a complaint of a shooting in the Morinville Estates Manufactured Home Community.

EMS and STARS attended, however 37-year-old Shayne Fry of St. Albert, Alta., was pronounced deceased at the scene.

Though investigation is still ongoing, preliminary findings suggest that the shooting was most likely targeted and RCMP does not believe there is a risk to the general public. Alberta RCMP Major Crimes Unit has taken carriage of the investigation, with assistance from Morinville RCMP General Investigation Section and Alberta RCMP Forensic Identification Services.






