Automated Traffic Enforcement Program to be discontinued in Morinville

On December 9, Morinville Council approved a motion to discontinue the Automated Traffic Enforcement (ATE) program in Morinville.

Recent provincial rule changes have made the program operationally unfeasible, as meeting the updated

requirements would require additional resources without demonstrating a measurable safety benefit.

Over the past year, ATE has not been in operation, and Morinville has seen few speed-related complaints and no significant change in the number of tickets issued. Both Morinville

and the RCMP have noted that during this period, drivers continued to make safe, responsible choices, leading to fewer community concerns.

Morinville has invested in several traffic-calming and safety measures that have proven more effective than automated enforcement, including:

- **Flashing traffic**

beacons, which have shown strong results in slowing drivers

- **Updated signage**, including high-visibility school and playground zone markers

- **Speed limit reductions** in key areas introduced last year

- **Targeted CPO and RCMP patrols** focusing on high-risk areas and times

Together, these measures have contributed to safer roadways and a noticeable reduction in complaints.

"Community safety is one of Morinville's core pillars, and it's something we all contribute to," said Sergeant William Norton, Town of Morinville.

"Our residents have

shown time and again that they make responsible choices behind the wheel. We trust that they will continue to do their part to keep our roads safe for everyone."

This change does not affect posted speed limits within the community. Speed limits remain



Spreading kindness in Morinville this Christmas

As the Christmas season approaches, many Morinville residents are looking for ways to give back and support neighbours who may be facing a difficult winter.

Rising costs, colder weather, and ongoing economic pressures have created a greater need than usual for assistance programs, and local groups are stepping up once again.

From food donations to winter wear to basic necessities, several initiatives across town are inviting the community to come together and lend a

hand.

The Morinville Food Bank is feeling the strain earlier than expected this year. Volunteers say the shelves are noticeably thin, and donations are urgently needed as families prepare for the holiday season. Items in highest demand include canned vegetables – carrots, peas, niblets corn, and yellow beans – as well as sugar, coffee, pudding and Jell-O cups, school snacks, jam, and basic condiments such as mayonnaise, mustard, and ketchup. These everyday staples help families prepare warm meals when budgets

are tight. Donations can be dropped off at Sobeys, No Frills, or the Morinville Chamber of Commerce office.

Beyond food, local agencies are also working to ensure residents have access to essential personal care items.

The Home with Dignity Hampers project continues its mission of helping individuals settle into low-income housing with the basic hygiene supplies many take for granted. Shampoo, conditioner, toothbrushes, soap, razors, deodorant, lotions, and other new items are always welcomed.

For families struggling to make ends meet over the holidays, the Morinville Adopt a Family Foundation, along with the Midstream Support Society and Morinville FCSS, is once again offering confidential applications for its annual Christmas Hampers.

These hampers provide not only food and essentials but also a sense of comfort and connection during a time that can feel isolating for those in need. Details

are available by calling 780-939-7839 or emailing fcss@morinville.ca.

But this year, one of the most pressing concerns is warm winter clothing. Local service groups report a growing number of residents – particularly families with young children – who do not have adequate jackets, boots, or snow pants for the months ahead. With Alberta winter temperatures known to drop rapidly and sharply, proper winter gear can mean the difference between staying healthy and staying indoors.

The “Keep Warm Morinville” program

aims to fill that gap. Organized through FCSS and supported by the Midstream Thrift Store and Fusion Thrift Shoppe, the initiative collects gently used winter clothing and redistributes it to anyone who needs it, no questions asked. Coats, mittens, gloves, scarves, toques, insulated boots, snow pants, and even thick socks are all appreciated. Donations can be made at either thrift store, and those needing winter wear can arrange a discreet pickup by contacting FCSS.
