# Service Canada and CRA representatives coming to Morinville for free outreach clinic

For many people, dealing with government paperwork can be confusing and time-consuming. From applying for a social insurance number to accessing benefits like the Canadian Dental Care Plan or employment insurance, understanding what steps to take – and where to go – can feel overwhelming.

On Tuesday, March 10, 2026, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., representatives from Service Canada and the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) are bringing their expertise directly to Morinville at the Morinville Community Cultural Centre, making it easier

for locals to get the help they need without leaving town.

The free outreach clinic will offer one-on-one assistance for a variety of services, including:

- Social insurance number (SIN) applications
- Canadian Dental Care Plan enrollment
- Employment insurance (EI)
- Canada Pension Plan (CPP) benefits
- And other government programs

Staff will guide attendees through the process step by step, helping to ensure forms are completed correctly, questions are answered, and residents leave with a clear understanding of their next steps. Whether you're applying for the first time, updating information, or simply need advice on eligibility, this clinic is designed to make navigating federal

programs as straightforward as possible.

The event is particularly valuable for seniors, newcomers to Canada, and anyone who may find accessing these services challenging.

Seniors and people with limited mobility often face extra hurdles when trying to reach larger centres for assistance, so bringing the clinic to Morinville offers a convenient, supportive alternative.

Even for residents who are familiar with these programs, having experts available for guidance can save time, prevent mistakes, and provide peace of mind.

Attendees are encouraged to register in advance to secure an appointment and to check which documents are needed for their specific needs.

Proper preparation ensures each visit is efficient and

productive, and allows staff to provide the most helpful support possible.

### Morinville RCMP Weekly Round-Up

Morinville RCMP members responded to several calls for service throughout the past few days (January 23rd to January 29th, 2026):

During this 6-day reporting period, the Morinville RCMP handled 86 new occurrences, including calls for service and traffic-related interactions with the public.

**January 25, 2026:** In the early morning hours of January 25, 2026, Morinville RCMP were making proactive patrols and located an impaired driver who was promptly removed from the roadways. The 39-year-old male was issued an Immediate Roadside Sanction (IRS) which included: a 90-day license suspension, \$1200.00 fine, and a 30-day vehicle seizure.

**January 28, 2026:** Morinville RCMP are investigating a theft that occurred from the Petro Canada in Namao. An unknown suspect attended the location and stole approximately \$150.00 worth of items. The suspect is described as approximately 30 years old, tall, with short dark hair. The suspect departed in a black Audi, with an unknown license plate. The investigation remains ongoing.

Morinville RCMP are currently investigating several reports of fraudulent activity in the area and are reminding residents to stay vigilant. Fraudsters often use text

messages, emails, and phone calls to trick people into sharing personal or financial information. To help protect yourself, please keep the following safety tips in mind:

- Do not click on links from unknown or suspicious senders.
- If you receive a message claiming to be from your bank, contact your bank directly using the phone number on the back of your card or their official website. Never use the number provided in the message, as it could be fraudulent.
- Never share personal information, passwords, or banking details by text, email, or over the phone unless you initiated the contact.
- Be cautious of messages creating urgency, fear, or pressure to act quickly.
- Regularly monitor your bank and credit card statements for unauthorized transactions.
- Report suspected fraud to your financial institution immediately and notify police.

Staying informed and cautious can help prevent you and others in our community from becoming victims.



# 1.5 billion barrels: Alberta oil production sets a new record in 2025

What would fill approximately 96,000 Olympic-sized swimming pools? Alberta's oil production last year.

The numbers from the Alberta Energy Regulator are in for the final month of last year and show that 2025 set a new record for oil production in the province

at 4.1 million barrels per day (bbl/d) for total output of over 1.5 billion barrels, 84% of which was from the oil sands.


Average daily production in the province was up by 166,000 bbl/d or 4.2% compared to 2024.

A key enabler of the rise in production is the extra egress capacity provided by the Trans Mountain pipeline expansion

(TMX) that was completed in 2024. The pipeline, which has a nameplate capacity of 890,000 bbl/d (up from 300,000 before the expansion project), has also enabled more oil exports from Alberta to Asia.

As the chart no. 2 shows, the value of Alberta's oil exports to Asia went from zero before the expanded

pipeline began operations to over \$1.1 billion as of October of last year.

Enhancements to the existing pipeline system and filling TMX to capacity will facilitate additional production in 2026.

We expect real oil and gas exports to grow at around 2% both this year and in 2027.

At some point, though, without a new pipeline in place, a lack of pipeline capacity will once again act as a constraint on output growth, possibly


as soon as 2028.

While the rise in production provides a boost to economic growth in Alberta via ongoing extraction activity and increased exports,

we expect oil and gas capital spending to remain flat this year.

Absent final decisions on a new pipeline, the focus will remain on

incremental production growth, efficiency, shareholder returns and debt repayment rather than greenfield expansion and new mega-projects.



## Alberta RCMP encourages distraction-free driving

The Alberta RCMP is reminding drivers that it's essential to remain distraction free.

Operating a vehicle requires a motorist's complete attention to be aware of other vehicles and pedestrians and reduce the risk of collision.

In 2025, the Alberta RCMP issued a total of 3,337 tickets for distracted driving. Help stay distraction free on the roads with following tips:

• **If it impairs your driving, it's a distraction.** Distracted driving is not limited to texting or talking on a handheld device while operating a vehicle – it also includes personal grooming, reading, writing, adjusting GPS or audio devices,

attending to passengers or pets and any other activity that might impair your ability to operate a vehicle safely.

• **Plan ahead.** Before putting your vehicle into drive, prepare by pre-setting your hands-free device, GPS, radio or music.

• **Pull over and put it in park.** If you need to text, make a call or engage in any distracting activity, pull over where it's safe and park your vehicle.

Simply stopping at a red light and engaging in a distracted activity is not safe and is still distracted driving.

• **Distracted driving isn't worth it.** The penalty for distracted driving in Alberta is a \$300 fine and three demerit

points. The bigger price you pay is risking your own safety and the safety of others.

"Distracted driving is a common bad habit among drivers," says Sgt. Darin Turnbull, Alberta RCMP Traffic.

"It may not seem like a big deal to check a text or change a song, but it only takes a second where your attention is diverted for a collision to take place. Distractions behind the wheel are never worth putting yourself, or other motorists, at risk."
