Franco-Albertan Flag raised in Morinville and Legal during Alberta's Francophonie Month

The Franco-Albertan flag was raised in Morinville on March 10 during a ceremony held outside the Musée Morinville Museum.

Students and teachers from Four Winds Public School joined Mayor Simon Boersma, members of council, the Centralta Tourism Society, the Association canadienne-française de l'Alberta (ACFA) Centralta Region, the Morinville Historical

and Cultural Society, and local residents for the event.

Speakers included ACFA Centralta Executive Director Erika Aubertin and Mayor Boersma.

A separate flag-raising ceremony took place in Legal on March 6 at École Citadelle.

The event featured entertainment by Jonathan Hache, who performs under the moniker JONO.

The performance was held live at the school and livestreamed to students at École Alexandre-Taché in St. Albert.

Speakers at the Legal ceremony included Legal Councillor Kevin Veenstra, École

Citadelle Principal Valérie Bélanger, student Brielle Rivard, and ACFA Centralta Executive Director Erika Aubertin.

The Government of Alberta invites the public across the province to attend Franco-Albertan flag-raising ceremonies as part of Alberta's Francophonie Month in March.

The symbolic events celebrate the vitality, diversity, and pride of Alberta's Francophone community and highlight the contributions of Francophone communities across the province.

This year, flag-raising ceremonies have been held in several

communities, including Saint Paul, Legal, St. Albert, Edmonton, Jasper, Canmore, Red Deer, Calgary, Lethbridge, Wood Buffalo, Plamondon, and Grande Prairie.

In 2026, Alberta's Francophonie Month holds special

significance as it marks the centennial of the ACFA, the organization representing Alberta's Francophone community.

The provincial government has officially recognized 2026 as the Year of the Francophonie in Alberta,

acknowledging the history, engagement, and contributions of Francophones and Francophiles to the province.



Free indoor walking track access offered to Morinville residents until trail lighting is restored

Morinville residents will have temporary free access to the walking track at the Morinville Leisure Centre (MLC) while the town finalizes a long-term solution for lighting along park and trail pathways.

In 2025, an engineering assessment identified structural issues with aluminum light poles along pathways in parks

and trail areas. To ensure public safety, all affected poles were removed. Street and sidewalk light poles were not affected.

Town officials are now finalizing plans for a permanent approach to restore trail lighting.

A detailed update, including options for council approval, is expected in spring 2026.

In the meantime, council has approved temporary access to the MLC walking track during reduced daylight hours.

The track will be available to Morinville residents from March 11 to April 30, 2026.

Residents can obtain a free track wristband by visiting the MLC Customer Service Desk.

Government-issued identification showing a Morinville address is required for a visual check; no copies or scans are taken.

Children 11 and under must be accompanied by a parent or guardian on the track, and parents or guardians may present identification on behalf of their children.

No registration is required, and access is available on a daily drop-in basis. Standard facility rules apply.

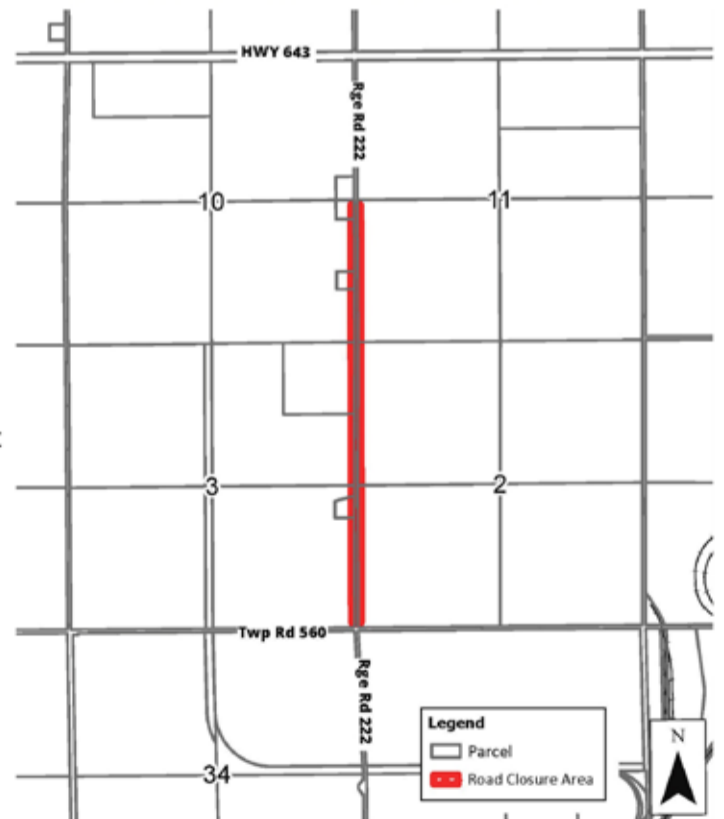

Spring Planting Prep: Timing and Tips for Alberta Fields

Alberta's spring can be unpredictable, but early prep pays off.

Aim to seed when soil at depth hits 5-10°C (around early May in central/northern areas like Whitecourt). For cereals like wheat and barley, target May 1-31 for best yields and quality. Peas thrive in cool conditions

- plant as soon as soil is workable (they tolerate light frost).

Follow peas with barley for nutrient benefits from their shallow roots.

General tips: Test soil, inoculate pulses if needed, use optimal seeding rates (e.g., 20-25 plants/

ft² for malt barley), and avoid deep placement in cold soils. With forecasts showing potential shifts toward more canola or wheat, rotate wisely to manage diseases and build soil health.

Barley & Wheat Planting Pointers

for Prairie Success
Optimal window: Early to mid-May for highest yields and quality.

Seeding rate: Target stands of 20-30 plants/ft²; adjust for variety and conditions.

Rotation wins: Barley after peas

often yields best due to leftover moisture/nutrients.

Variety focus: Prioritize lodging resistance and maturity for your zone.

Extra: Seed treatments for disease protection; monitor for sawfly in droughtprone spots.

MLA Dale Nally spent March 2 to 6 visiting local organizations and connecting with constituents during Constituency Week, a dedicated period when elected officials step out of the legislature to spend time in their home communities. Constituency Week gave residents the opportunity to meet their MLA, discuss local concerns, and see firsthand how government programs and grants were making an impact.

Throughout the week, Nally attended a wide range of events, from grant presentations to charitable initiatives, highlighting

Constituency Week also included supporting local charitable initiatives. Nally stopped by the St. Albert Firefighters Roof Top Campaign to encourage residents to contribute to muscular dystrophy research and highlighted the importance of community support for local firefighters.

He also shared the provincial spring budget update with members of the Morinville and District Chamber of Commerce, connecting with local business owners and constituents while discussing provincial programs and economic priorities.
