## Answer the call: Volunteer as a firefighter in Morinville

When a fire breaks out or an emergency strikes, the people who rush in are often volunteers from your own community.

Morinville Fire Services is inviting residents to step into this challenging and rewarding role.

Volunteer and casual Paid-Per-Call firefighters respond to emergencies, assist with rescues, and play a vital part in keeping Morinville safe.

Applications are accepted year-round, but anyone hoping to join this year's recruit class must apply by October 31.

Candidates must live in Morinville, be at least 18 years old, hold a high school diploma or equivalent and have a valid Alberta driver's license.

Physical fitness, the ability to communicate clearly in English, and qualities such as motivation, teamwork, and a strong work ethic are essential.

The process begins with a physical fitness test at the Don Found Fire Station, where candidates perform demanding

exercises while wearing full firefighting gear.

This includes a helmet, gloves, jacket, pants, boots, and a self-contained breathing apparatus, all weighing approximately 22 kilograms.

A fall-protection harness is used during ladder exercises.

Those who pass the physical test advance to interviews and additional assessments, including reference checks, documentation review, and recruit class training sessions.

Preparation is important. Applicants are encouraged to

# Local intuitive teacher helps others connect with inner guidance

Residents in Morinville and surrounding communities are being invited to explore their intuition through tarot and energy work, thanks to local teacher Megan Wenmann of Reiki Healing and Readings.

Wenmann, who has more than 25 years of experience working with intuition and energy, recently hosted a tarot workshop that brought together participants of all experience levels.

By the end of the session, attendees were not only learning the basics of tarot, but also gaining confidence in reading for themselves and others.

"I've always experienced life through intuition and energy," Wenmann said.

"For a long time, I just didn't have the language for it. Tarot and Reiki gave me a way to understand

what I was already sensing."

Her path into teaching developed naturally.

While working one-on-one with clients, Wenmann found that guidance and learning often became part of her sessions.

That realization led her to expand into group classes, creating a space where others could explore and develop their own intuitive abilities.

Her approach focuses less on memorizing meanings and more on building trust in personal insight.

"I believe we're all born with the ability to sense and work with energy," she said. "Tarot and Reiki simply give that ability structure. My goal is to help people trust what they're already feeling."

Wenmann began reading tarot as a teenager and later discovered Reiki during a period of personal growth.

She describes Reiki as a grounding practice that helped her better understand energy in a tangible way, eventually

leading her to offer sessions to others seeking clarity and balance.

Participants in her classes and sessions often report a range of benefits, including improved sleep, reduced stress, and increased confidence in decision-making.

Others find comfort in the sense of connection and clarity the practices can provide.

One particularly meaningful experience for Wenmann

helping the client feel supported in moving forward.

"It was a reminder of how powerful these sessions can be in helping people find peace," she said.

In addition to private sessions, Wenmann teaches workshops at Venus in St. Albert and plans to attend the Morinville

Farmers Market beginning in May.

Her next class, focused on psychic development, is scheduled for April 15.

Wenmann says her work ultimately comes down to helping people reconnect with themselves.

"Healing comes from being seen, heard, and guided back to trust."

arrive rested and nourished, stay hydrated, and avoid alcohol, smoking, or caffeine in the hours before testing.

The fitness stage begins with a brief orientation to familiarize candidates with each task, followed by short rest periods between exercises while still wearing full protective gear.

Successful candidates then enter an eight-month probationary period, which includes a four-month progress evaluation and a final review.

This ensures that new firefighters are fully prepared for the physical and mental demands of the role and ready to serve the community.

Becoming a firefighter in Morinville

is more than responding to emergencies – it's joining a team that values dedication, resilience, and the desire to make a difference.

# Sturgeon County issues Spring Breakup Advisory as road conditions deteriorate

Sturgeon County officials are warning residents to prepare for rapidly changing road conditions as spring breakup arrives earlier than usual this year.

Warmer temperatures, combined with forecasts of additional rain and snow over the

coming weeks, are accelerating the seasonal thaw.

Road surfaces may become soft and unstable, with conditions shifting throughout the day as temperatures rise and fall. Drivers are advised to use caution, especially on rural routes where deterioration can occur quickly.

Crews are actively monitoring roads for issues such as localized washouts and flooding. According to the County, maintenance and emergency

response teams are fully deployed to respond to repairs based on urgency.

In some cases, temporary road closures may be necessary.

## Morinville Community Grant Program accepting applications until March 31

Residents and community groups in Morinville have until March 31 to apply

for funding through the Town's Community Grant Program, which supports initiatives aimed at enhancing local quality of life.

The intake period for applications opened on Feb. 15 and is available to not-for-profit community groups, teams,

organizations, associations, and individual residents. Priority is given to applicants based within Morinville.

However, groups from outside the community may still be considered if they are not-for-profit and their proposed initiative directly

benefits the Morinville community.

To be eligible, applicants must contribute at least 50 per cent of the funding they request.

This contribution can come in the form of cash, in-kind support, or a combination of both.

Funding is available

across several categories designed to support a broad range of community needs.

Projects under the arts and culture category should promote creative expression, including literary, visual, performing, heritage, and media arts, while increasing community

participation in cultural activities.

Applications focused on recreation and sport development are expected to encourage active lifestyles and community engagement.

**PUBLIC HEARING – Bylaw 1700/25**  
Resource Extraction Regulation Amendments

**Sturgeon County Council requests public input on proposed Bylaw 1700/25.**

An extraction operator wants to amend the setback regulations that were implemented in 2023. While the standard setbacks for resource extraction to surrounding dwellings would remain, there would be no defined setback for a dwelling:

1. located on the parcel being extracted
2. on lands owned by the operator
3. with written landowner consent for a reduced setback
4. constructed after the land was redistricted for resource extraction

Proposed change #3 would re-introduce private operator and landowner agreements that were used before 2023.

A bylaw is needed to amend the Land Use Bylaw, and a public hearing must be held.

# Have you tested your home for radon gas?

(NC) Whether you own your home or rent it, the safety of your living space is essential.

One challenge is that not every risk to your home is obvious.

Some you may not be aware of, and others, such as radon gas, are invisible.

If you haven't tested your home's radon levels yet, here's why you should:

## How does radon get into your home?

Radon gas is produced from uranium decaying underground. The air pressure inside your home is usually lower than the surrounding soil, which draws air and other gasses, including radon, up and into the home.

All homes in Canada

have radon, but levels vary from one house to another – the only way to know your home's level is to test.

## Why is radon gas dangerous?

The danger comes when it's allowed to build up high levels indoors. Exposure to high levels of radon increases the risk of lung cancer significantly.

In fact, it's the number one cause of lung cancer in non-smokers in Canada. It's also on the rise: over the last decade, household radon levels across the country have been increasing, possibly due to better sealing for home energy efficiency.

Recent data shows

high levels in one in five Canadian homes.

## What can homeowners do?

Testing for radon is easy: you just need a do-it-yourself test kit or an electronic radon monitor.

Your home's levels rise and fall over time, so doing a long-term test over three months will let you estimate your annual exposure.

Here are some tips for optimal testing:

- Put the device on the lowest lived-in level of the home, such as a finished basement, family room or playroom.

- Use a flat surface, or hang it on the wall or from the ceiling, keeping it between half a metre and two metres off the floor.

- Avoid installing it near windows, vents, doors and exterior walls. Don't put the device in kitchens, laundry rooms, closets or unfinished basements.

- Leave the device alone for at least three months – set a reminder to check it at that time, so you don't forget.

If the testing shows a high level of radon it can be fixed.

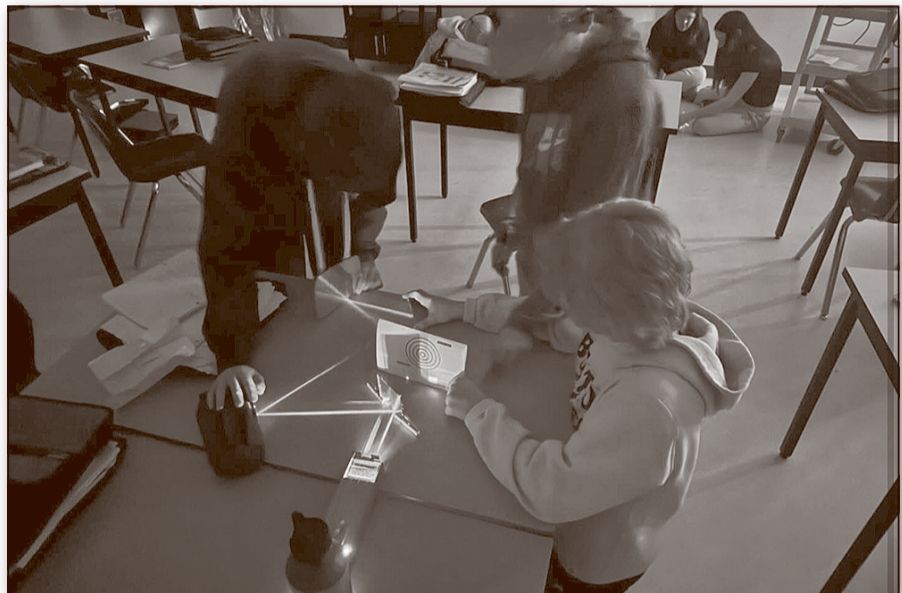
A certified professional can install a radon reduction system in just one to two days.

The system works by giving radon gas an easier path to escape outdoors. It costs less to install than replacing a furnace or air

conditioner and can reduce radon levels in your home by up to 90 per cent.

The danger of radon is real, but by testing for it and taking action to reduce the level in your home, protecting yourself is easier than you might think.
