# Spring events and markets kick off busy season in Morinville

Morinville is heading into a busy spring and summer season, with markets, festivals and community events already drawing strong support from residents, vendors and local organizations.

The Morinville Farmers' Market officially launched its 2026 outdoor season on May 3, bringing vendors and visitors back to 104 Street near the Rendez Vous Centre for another year of weekly

shopping and community connection.

The market will run every Sunday through Oct. 4 and features a wide range of products, including handmade crafts, artisan goods, baked treats, locally produced food items and specialty products.

Beyond shopping opportunities, the market continues to serve as a gathering place where residents can connect with local entrepreneurs and support small businesses throughout the season.

Opening day drew steady traffic despite cool spring temperatures, with vendors welcoming shoppers eager to browse the first outdoor market

of the year.

Several additional market dates and seasonal events are also planned in the coming months, helping build momentum for what organizers hope will be another active year for community participation in Morinville.

A special market is scheduled during the Morinville Festival Days celebrations on June 20 at the Morinville Community Cultural Centre from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Organizers are also planning a Canada Day market on July 1 at the Garrison Fitness Centre from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Earlier this spring, the Morinville and

District Chamber of Commerce hosted its annual Swing into Spring Show and Sale at the Morinville Leisure Centre.

The event featured more than 75 exhibitors showcasing local businesses, services, handmade products

and community organizations.

Families attending the event were also able to enjoy a dedicated family fun zone, while vendors had the opportunity to connect directly with residents ahead of the busy summer season.

Despite challenging weather conditions during the event weekend, organizers said attendance remained strong and thanked residents and vendors for their continued support.

**Alberta RCMP advise public on protecting personal information**

The Alberta RCMP are advising residents to take proactive steps to protect their personal information and reduce the risk of identity theft and fraud. Protecting personal identification information is an important part of everyday safety.

Criminals may attempt to obtain personal details through a variety of methods, including phishing scams, data breaches, mail theft, or social engineering, and use that information to commit fraud.

The Alberta RCMP recommend the following steps to safeguard your personal information:

- Review bank and credit card statements for any unauthorized transactions and report suspicious activity immediately.
- Consider requesting a free credit report from recognized Canadian credit bureaus and review it for unfamiliar accounts or inquiries.
- Fraudsters may use stolen information to create convincing phishing emails, phone calls, or text messages. Do not provide personal or financial information unless you have verified the source.
- Use strong, unique passwords for online accounts and enable multi-factor authentication where available.

• Avoid sharing sensitive details such as your Social Insurance Number (SIN) unless necessary and ensure documents containing personal information are stored securely.

• You may contact a credit bureau to place a fraud alert on your file, which can help prevent unauthorized accounts from being opened in your name.

• When possible, deal with your financial institution in-person should one or more of your bank accounts become compromised. Unfortunately, an internet search may provide a fake toll-free number to an individual who may victimize you further.

• If you believe you have been a victim of identity theft or fraud, report it to your local police service and the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre at [www.antifraudcentre-centreantifraude.ca](http://www.antifraudcentre-centreantifraude.ca). Early reporting can help limit potential damage and assist in ongoing investigations.

**Grade 9 students attend Sturgeon Region P.A.R.T.Y. Program focused on safety and injury prevention**

Approximately 250 Grade 9 students from schools across the region gathered at Morinville Community High School (MCHS) on April 29 to participate in the Sturgeon Region P.A.R.T.Y. program, a national initiative aimed at promoting injury prevention and healthy decision-making

among youth.

The event was emceed by Jennifer Penner, facilitator with Safe Communities for Sturgeon County, who explained that the P.A.R.T.Y. program – Prevent Alcohol and Risk-related Trauma in Youth – is delivered in communities across Canada to educate young people about the consequences of high-risk behaviours.

The full-day program took place at both the Morinville Community Cultural Centre and MCHS, featuring presentations from local emergency

and support services.

Participating organizations included Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Sturgeon County and Morinville fire departments, Sturgeon County and Morinville Enforcement Services, emergency medical services, the Central Alberta Regional Victim Serving Society, and medical staff from the Sturgeon General Hospital.

A mock collision demonstration was held behind the school as part of the hands-on learning experience, illustrating the

real-life consequences of dangerous driving behaviours and the coordinated response of emergency personnel.

A key moment of the day was a presentation by Brenda McGaw of Shea-Lynn's Butterfly Effect.

McGaw shared the story of her daughter, Shea-Lynn McGaw, who died in a single-vehicle rollover on May 17, 2021, just 10 minutes from home.

Shea-Lynn, 16, had removed her seat belt moments before the crash to move within the vehicle and did

not properly secure it again. She was the only one of three occupants not wearing a seat belt correctly and was ejected from the vehicle, dying instantly. The other occupants, who remained properly restrained, survived with minor injuries.

During her presentation, McGaw displayed images of her daughter alongside a powerful visual showing a cross, flowers, and the time 5:12 p.m., paired with the message “three minutes without a seat belt.”

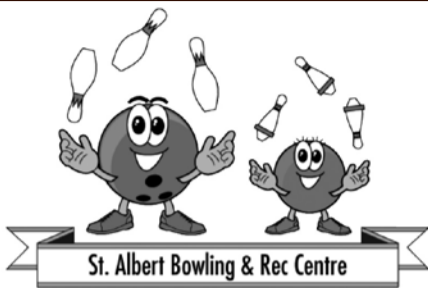



# Young entrepreneur grows 3D printing business near Morinville

An 11-year-old entrepreneur just outside Morinville is turning creativity into a growing business, capturing attention at local markets with her custom 3D-printed designs.

Avery, who operates under the name Dragon Eye Designs, began her journey with a love of crafting at a young age.

Each time she tried something new, she

would ask if she could set up a booth at a farmers' market – a goal that eventually became reality.

Her interest in 3D printing began while taking coding classes through Code Ninjas, where she learned how to create digital files using Tinkercad.

Although she wasn't printing at the time, the experience sparked a strong interest, and she spent the next two years asking for her own 3D printer.

That wish came true at Christmas 2024, when her family purchased her first machine. From there, her hobby quickly grew

into something more. Avery began creating items for herself, as well as for friends and family, and it wasn't long before her collection expanded.

She initially focused on fidget items, inspired by her own needs.

As someone who is neurodivergent, Avery relies on fidgets and found many of the options available in stores to be too similar. Wanting something different, she began designing and printing her own unique creations.

That idea soon turned into a business. After recognizing how much she enjoyed making the items – and how much others liked them – Avery was asked if she would like to take part in a farmers' market for real. She quickly said yes.

Last summer marked her first season, with appearances at the Morinville Farmers' Market as well as markets in Calahoo, Edmonton, Onoway and Whitecourt.

She is expected to return to Whitecourt again in August.

Today, Avery operates multiple machines, including three Bambu Lab A1

printers, an A1 Mini and a Bambu P1S. On busy days, all five printers run at once as she keeps up with demand.

Despite the growth, her favourite items to create remain fidgets.

The most rewarding part of the business for Avery is seeing the reaction from customers, particularly children choosing something they truly want.

"The thing she enjoys the most is making kids happy," said her grandmother, Kathy. "Seeing them choose something they really want brings her a lot of joy."

She also enjoys being able to give back to the community. Avery has contributed to several initiatives by creating raffle baskets, including for her ringette tournament, a school fundraiser and a Rivière Qui Barre community raffle.

While her business continues to grow, Avery maintains a balance between entrepreneurship and being a kid. She plays ringette in St. Albert, softball with Legal Lightning, and is in her third year with the Rivière Qui Barre Ranceros 4-H club.

Her grandmother, Kathy, plays a key supporting role,

helping monitor the printers during the school day and assisting with custom orders. She also produces display materials for Avery's market booth.

For Avery, Dragon Eye Designs is more than just a business – it is a creative outlet, a way to connect with others, and an opportunity to make people smile.

She urged students to have conversations about seat belt use, emphasizing that a single decision can save a life. She also reminded students of their value and the impact their loss would have on loved ones.

Many students approached her afterward to speak further.

Students were divided into smaller groups throughout the day to attend concurrent sessions led by RCMP officers, firefighters, trauma specialists, and victim services representatives, including a postmortem-focused educational component.

Information booths were also set up, offering resources on a range of safety topics. Organizations present included Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD), along with Sturgeon County Protective Services, which promoted the upcoming Youth Emergency Services (YES) Academy scheduled for July 20-22, 2026. Enforcement Services provided information on road safety topics such as speed limits, recreational vehicles, motorcycles, bicycles, pedestrian

awareness, railway crossings, wildlife collisions, rural safety, and the consequences of impaired driving.

Students also had access to a driving simulator provided by the Youth Initiatives & Education in Lifestyles & Driving Association (Y.I.E.L.D.), offering an interactive learning experience.

A second full-day session of the program was held on April 30 for additional students.

Penner acknowledged the

many community partners and sponsors who made the event possible, including Enbridge through its Fueling Futures Grant, Sobeys, Tim Hortons, Sturgeon Rural Crime Watch, Redwater Citizens on Patrol, Sturgeon County, the Town of Morinville, and the Rotary Club of Morinville Sturgeon. 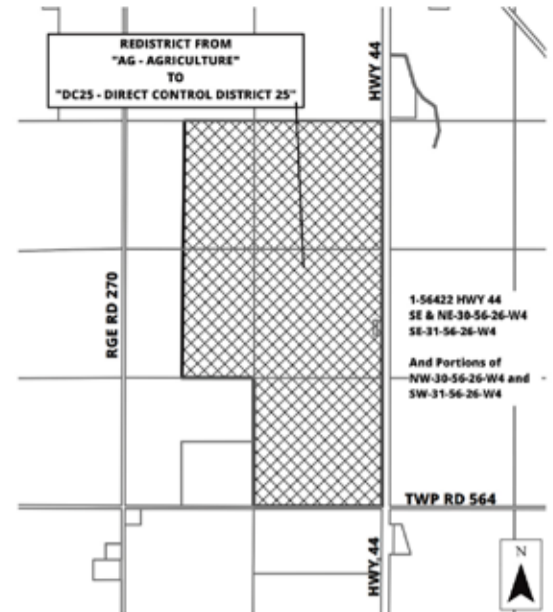

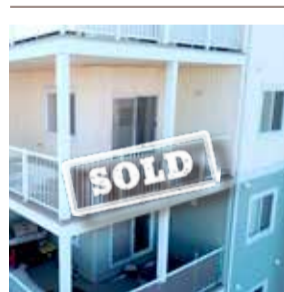
